TERMS AND CONDITIONS / TOUR CONTRACT

Pentecost Tours, Inc. is not a participant in the California Travel Consumer Restitution Fund. This transaction is not covered by the California Travel Consumer Restitution Fund. You are not eligible to file a claim against that Fund in the event of Pentecost Tours, Inc.'s default. However, Pentecost Tours, Inc. does maintain a Trust account for tour deposits at MainSource Bank in Batesville, IN.

TOUR PRICE: Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 11/16/2015 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 36 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge. Airport fees, departure taxes and fuel surcharges, estimated at \$699 are included but subject to an increase/decrease when the airline provides the confirmed "actual" figure at ticketing.

ACCOMMODATIONS: In first class hotels or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$79 per night and based on availability. Requests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supplement will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

MEALS: Eight full hot breakfasts and six dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included.

SIGHTSEING: By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to availability.

NOT INCLUDED: 1: Tips to guides and drivers, meal servers and luggage handlers (est. - \$13 per day); and 2: optional travel insurance. An amount to cover these items will be added to your original invoice. Also not included: domestic baggage fees, passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned and items of a personal nature. Note: Due to limited storage space on motor coaches, Pentecost Tours entitles each passenger to one checked bag and one carry-on bag that meets airline "size/weight" allowances. Domestic baggage fees, overweight baggage charges, and fees for additional bags fall under the responsibility of the passenger. Be aware, while you may agree to pay fees for additional luggage, there may not be room on the motor coach.

ASSISTANCE: Pilgrims who require personal assistance must be accompanied by a paying passenger who will provide that assistance.

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION: A deposit of \$500 per person is required to secure reservations, which sum will be applied to the price of the tour, with the balance to be paid in full no later than 7/20/2016. Payment of remaining balance received after 7/20/2016 will incur a \$50 penalty. Reservations made within 92 days of departure may be subject to a late charge. In the event of cancellation, refund will be made up to 6/22/2016 with a \$100 administrative fee plus any airline cancellation penalties. From 6/22/2016 to 7/20/2016 the cancellation penalties. From 6/22/2016, refund will be subject to a minimum 40% cancellation fee plus any airline cancellation penalties, or an amount equal to expenses to the tour operator, whichever is greater. There will be no refund for cancellations within 33 days of departure. Cancellation must be in writing and the effective date will be the date that Pentecost Tours, Inc. receives it. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 120 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. Upon cancellation of the transportation or travel services, where you, the customer, are not at fault and have not cancelled in violation of the terms and conditions of this contract for transportation or travel services, all sums paid to Pentecost Tours, Inc. for services not received by you will be promptly refunded by Pentecost Tours, Inc. in writing.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round trip San Francisco/Venice and Rome/San Francisco on economy class jet via Delta or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare, subject to participation of ten persons on entire flight itinerary. If cancellation is effected by passenger after 7/20/2016, or after air tickets are written, whichever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.

INSURANCE: Insurance is NOT included in the tour price. Because of the cost of medical care outside the United States, the fact that Medicare does not provide coverage outside the United States, the possibility that your own insurance provider may not cover you outside the United States, and due to the potentially high cost of escorted air evacuation, travel insurance is strongly recommended. Consequently, for the protection of our clients, you will be mailed a travel insurance brochure/policy along with an insurance waiver form in the event you choose to decline coverage. The effective date of coverage will be the date that the insurance premium is paid and not the date of the initial deposit.

RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY: Land arrangements including surface transportation: Pentecost Tours, Inc., and the participating Tour Operators operate the land tours offered under this program only as agents of the railroads, car rental contractors, steamship lines, hotels, bus operators, sightseeing contractors and others that provide the actual land arrangements and are not liable for any act, omission, delay, injury, loss, damage or nonperformance occurring in connection with these land arrangements. Delta and other IATA carriers, steamship lines and other transportation companies whose services are featured in these tours are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time passengers are not on board their conveyance. The passage contract in use by these companies when issued shall constitute the sole contract between the companies and the purchaser of these tours and/or passage.

MISCELLANEOUS FEES: All changes must be in writing and may incur a per-person charge for each revision. Deposits received within 92 days of departure may incur a late registration fee.

LAND ARRANGEMENTS: The tour operator reserves the right to change the itinerary because of emergencies or extenuating circumstances beyond our control.

SPIRITUAL GUIDES: The Catholic Voice reserves the right to substitute spiritual guides for any reason at any time prior to departure.

Day 1: Thursday, October 20, 2016, USA / VENICE

Today we depart the United States for our overnight flight to Venice. Meals are served on board.



Day 2: Friday 10/21 VENICE

Upon our arrival in Venice, we have an orientation tour of the charming city. Venice is built on 118 tiny islands, criss-crossed by 160 canals, and linked by 400 footbridges.

We will celebrate **Mass and tour the Basilica di San Marco** (subject to confirmation). We proceed to our hotel to check in for a welcome dinner and overnight. **[D]**

Day 3: Saturday 10/22 VENICE

Morning **Mass** will be celebrated at **Chiesa di San Salvatore** (subject to confirmation). Then, the day is free to explore independently. Suggestions include:

- ▶The Merceria, the main shopping street of Venice, is located by the Chiesa di San Salvatore.
- ▶ Browse in and around St. Mark's Square.
- ► Take a water taxi to and between the three islands in the Venetian lagoon: Murano, Burano and Torcello.
- Murano is known for its beautiful glassworks. Since 1291, Murano has been a prominent supplier of beautiful glass products. Demonstrations by master craftsmen can be observed and their creations can be purchased in island shops.
- Burano is famous for its artisan lace. Treasures of the trade can be seen in the Lace Museum or purchased in lace boutiques. Besides lace, Burano's 15th-century leaning bell tower, part of San Martino Church, attracts tourists as well. If you are looking for souvenirs, restaurants, pastry shops, or stores you will want to spend some time on Via Galuppi, the island's main street. If natural beauty and tranquility attracts you, wander about. The colorful hues on homes attract artists to the area.
- ➡ Torcello, continually draws tourists to see the incredible mosaics within the 7th-century Cathedral of Santa Maria Dell'Assunta. One of the most impressive of the Byzantine mosaics is a depiction of the Last Judgment. This island is unique as it is primarily a nature reserve, accessible only by walk paths. Enjoy exploring this ancient island.
- Experience a gondola ride and weave through the canals. Note: standard ride is 40 minutes. Fares are higher at night. Gondolas will hold six people so standard fares can be divided. Most gondeliers speak some English. Different views of Venice can be seen on quiet, back canals where you won't be bumper to bumper. If you opt for a back canal, walk a few blocks off the main street (away from San Marco). If you are more interested in the tourist route, you will want to be on the Grand Canal. Venice is home to the world-famous opera house, Teatro La Fenice, one of the most renowned landmarks in Italian theatre. Daily tours of Teatro La Fenice are

- Art enthusiasts may want to visit the Guggenheim, a modern art museum, located on the Grand Canal.
- Enjoy observing the culture of the Venetians. Do a photo shoot and capture all the natural beauty and the "scenes" of the city.

This evening, join new friends or enjoy a private sampling of authentic northern Italian cuisine as **dinner is on your own**. Overnight in Venice. **[B]**

Day 4: Sunday 10/23 VENICE / PADUA / BOLO-GNA / FLORENCE

We depart Venice this morning and proceed to nearby Padua to visit and celebrate **Mass** at the Basilica of St. Anthony (subject to confirmation), built to honor the patron saint of lost things. Associated with many miracles, St. Anthony was renowned for his passion for preaching. Displayed in the Basilica are St. Anthony's tongue and vocal chords. These organs have remained incorrupt, although the rest of his body disintegrated after death. Our journey continués to Bologna, where we visit the **Duomo**, and the medieval brick church San Petronio. From there, we travel to beautiful Florence. Upon our arrival, we proceed to the **Academia** to see the original statue of "David". Our day concludes as we check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 5: Monday 10/24 FLORENCE / SIENA / AS-



This morning we begin with a panoramic view from the Piazza Michelangelo and an orientation tour of the city. Then, we proceed to visit and celebrate

Mass at the Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fio**re** (subject to confirmation), view the Baptistry and Campanile (bell tower). The Cathedral is the fourth largest church in Europe and the tallest building in present day Florence. Especially notable are the Baptistry's gilded bronze doors, which were done by Ghiberti in 1401. From there, we visit the historical and present day center of Florentine activity, the **Palazzo Vecchio** ("old palace") and the **Piazza della Signoria**. The Piazza is a popular area for people to stroll and gather; in the past it has served as a place of public meeting and even execution. There are many statues found in the vicinity - some are originals and some are copies, like David (the original is housed in the Academy of Fine Arts). From there, we depart Florence and proceed south to **Siena**, which boasts one of the most charming town squares in all of Italy, the Piazza del Campo. The fan shaped Piazza is home to the barebacked horse race, known as the Palio, and many other important events. We visit the **Basilica of St. Dom-** where we have an opportunity to view the relics of St. Catherine. We stop at the **Duomo** (cathedral) of Siena, a remarkable example of Italian Gothic architecture. We complete the journey through the Umbrian hills to peaceful Assisi, where we check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. **[B,D]**

Day 6: Tuesday 10/25 ASSISI / ROME

This morning, we will be escorted by cars to the **Church of St. Dam i a n o**. Then, we are driven to the **Basilica**



of St. Clare, which houses her incorrupt body in a crystal casket in the crypt. Off the main navé of the Basilica is the crucifix from which Christ spoke to St. Francis in San Damiano. St. Francis heard a voice say, "Go Francis, repair my church, which is in ruin." Thinking that God was telling him to rebuild San Damiano, Francis renounced worldly goods and began immediately to repair the building. Only later did the saint realize that God had been speaking of His living Church. Next, we visit and celebrate Mass (subject to confirmation) at one of Christianity's most revered shrines, the **Basilica of** St. Francis, and see the frescoes depicting events in the life of this gentle saint. Then, we continue to the lower plains of Assisi, taking time to explore the Basilica of St. Mary of the Angels, built in 1569 to protect the Portiuncula. The Portiuncula is the church that St. Francis and his brothers were given shortly after Pope Innocent III approved of their rule. We also see the statue of St. Francis with the live white doves, the thornless rose bush and the cave where St. Francis prayed in solitude. After spending time in Assisi, we depart for the Eternal City, Roma. Upon our arrival, we check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 7: Wednesday 10/26, ROME (PAPAL AUDI-

ENCE) Good morning, Roma! We attend the **Papal Audience** at St. Peter's today (provided our Holy Father is home). We listen to the words of His Holiness Pope Francis and receive his blessing with pilgrims from all over the world. After the audience, we visit and celebrate **Mass** at **St. Praxedes** (subject to confirmation) to venerate the



Column of Christ's Flagellation. This afternoon, we proceed to the beautiful **Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls** which houses the remains of St. Paul under the main altar. We also visit the **Catacombs** before we return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. **[B,D]**

Day 8: Thursday 10/27 ROME Our day begins with a **guided tour of St. Peter's Basilica**. The Basilica is very impressive with its imposing architecture, rich ornamentation, and marvelous works of art. We view one of Rome's most recognized works of art, Michelangelo's Pietá. From there, we visit the **Vatican Museum and Gallery, and the Sistine Chapel** (where Michelangelo's restored masterpieces adorn the ceilings and walls). The remainder of the day is free to explore independently. Suggestions, other than those we will be visiting tomorrow, include:

- ► Visit the Pantheon, Roman Forum, or Colosseum.
- ▶Go to Trevi Fountain to toss your coin in the famous fountain, which as legend says, will assure your return to
- Retail and souvenir shops are everywhere. Those interested in upscale shopping will want to head to the Spanish Steps, where the streets are lined with designer
- Stop for gelato (delicious Italian ice cream).
- Spend time in prayer at some of the magnificent churches that dot the streets of Rome.

This evening, join friends or enjoy a private sampling of authentic Italian cuisine at the restaurant or trattoria (local diner) of your choice as dinner is on **your own**. After dinner, you may want to capture the city lights of Roma at dusk. Overnight in Rome.

Day 9: Friday 10/28 ROME On our last day of sightseeing, we be-gin with **Mass** at the Basilica of St. Mary Major (subject to confirmation). Inside the Basilica we view relics



of Jesus' manger from Bethlehem. From there, we John Lateran. Constantine built the original church on this site when he ended the Christian persecutions. Here we see the Altar that holds the relics of Sts. Peter and Paul. Next to the Basilica is the Baptistery and across the street visit la Sancta Scalia (Holy Stairs), which were transported from Pilate's palace in Jerusalem and on which the Savior climbed before His crucifixion. Those who wish to pray each step on their knees may do so. The option to take the side stairs on foot is also available. This afternoon, spend some time at the sites of your choice. We gather this evening for a group dinner at **Risto**rante de Benito. Overnight in Rome. [B,D]

Day 10: Saturday, October 29, 2016, ROME / USA

Today we begin our journey back to the United States. We arrive home inspired by the holiness of the saints, mesmerized by the grandeur of God's landscape and blessed by memories we made as we experienced holy places throughout Italy. [B]
