TERMS AND CONDITIONS / TOUR CONTRACT

Pentecost Tours, Inc. is not a participant in the California Travel Consumer Restitution Fund. This transaction is not covered by the California Travel Consumer Restitution Fund. You are not eligible to file a claim against that Fund in the event of Pentecost Tours, Inc.'s default. However, Pentecost Tours, Inc. does maintain a Trust account for tour deposits at MainSource Bank in Batesville, IN.

TOUR PRICE: Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 11/30/2015 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 36 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge.

ACCOMMODATIONS: In first class hotels or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$59 per night and based on availability. Requests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supplement will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

MEALS: Nine full hot breakfasts and seven dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included, as are all governmental and local taxes on hotels and meals. Airport fees, departure taxes, and fuel surcharges are estimated on the original invoice and adjusted at ticket time.

SIGHTSEEING: By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to availability.

are subject to availability. **NOT INCLUDED:** 1: Airport fees, departure taxes and fuel surcharges (est. - \$549); 2: tips to guides and drivers, meal servers and luggage handlers (est. - \$13 per day); and 3: optional travel insurance. An amount to cover these items will be added to your original invoice, Also not included: domestic baggage fees, passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned and items of a personal nature. Note: Due to limited storage space on motor coaches, Pentecost Tours entitles each passenger to one checked bag and one carry-on bag that meets airline "size/weight" allowances. Domestic baggage fees, overweight baggage charges, and fees for additional bags fall under the responsibility of the passenger. Be aware, while you may agree to pay fees for additional luggage, there may not be room on the motor coach.

ASSISTANCE: Pilgrims who require personal assistance must be accompanied by a paying passenger who will provide that assistance.

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION: A deposit of \$500 per person is required to secure reservations, which sum will be applied to the price of the tour, with the balance to be paid in full no later than 7/18/2016. Payment of remaining balance received after 7/18/2016 will incur a \$50 penalty. Reservations made within 92 days of departure may be subject to a late charge. In the event of cancellation, refund will be made up to 6/20/2016 with a \$100 administrative fee plus any airline cancellation penalties. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 120 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel services, where you, the customer, are not at fault and have not cancelled in violation of the terms and conditions of this contract for transportation or travel services, all sums paid to Pentecost Tours. Inc. for services not received by you

will be promptly refunded by Pentecost Tours, Inc. to you unless you otherwise advise Pentecost Tours, Inc. in writing.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round trip USA/Dublin and Dublin/USA on economy class jet via Delta or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare, subject to participation of ten persons on entire flight itinerary. If cancellation is effected by passenger after 7/18/2016, or after air tickets are written, whichever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.

INSURANCE: Insurance is NOT included in the tour price. Because of the cost of medical care outside the United States, the fact that Medicare does not provide coverage outside the United States, the possibility that your own insurance provider may not cover you outside the United States, and due to the potentially high cost of escorted air evacuation, travel insurance is strongly recommended. Consequently, for the protection of our clients, you will be mailed a travel insurance brochure/policy along with an insurance waiver form in the event you choose to decline coverage. The effective date of coverage will be the date that the insurance premium is paid and not the date of the initial deposit.

Day 1: Tuesday, October 18, 2016, USA / DUBLIN

Pilgrims are welcomed at an international airport for our departing flight to the Emerald Isle aboard a wide-bodied jet, arriving the next morning. Meals are served on board the aircraft.



DOWNPATRICK DUBLIN / DOWNPATRICK / BELFAST

Upon our arrival in Dublin, we meet our full-time tour escort, board our private coach, and proceed north to Downpatrick. We stop in for a visit at the St. Patrick's Centre, where Dr. Tim Campbell will speak on St. Patrick's vision. Then, we visit the Down Cathedral, the historical burial place of Saint Patrick and visit his grave. We continue to Belfast and proceed to Mass at Saint Malachy's Church (subject to confirma-

tion), the 3rd oldest Catholic Church in the city of Belfast. It's ecclesiastical style was inspired by the Tudor period but its fan vaulted ceilings are an architectural adaptation from the Henry VII Chapel in Westminster Abbey. The church boasts the largest bell in Belfast which sounds at least three times daily. After Mass, we check in at our hotel for a welcome dinner and overnight. **[D]**

Day 3: Thursday 10/20, BELFAST / GIANT'S CAUSEWAY / BELFAST

Our morning begins as we travel 60 miles north to see the see **Giant's Causeway**, a unique geological landscape that is truly unlike any place else on earth. The causeway's interlocking hexagonal columns, resulting from the basaltic lava of an ancient volcanic eruption 6 million years ago, forever changed County Antrim's northern coast, earning it the prestige of a "Unesco World Heritage Site" title. Reading and hearing about the causeway does not begin to offer any realistic glimpse into this natural phenomenon. Only seeing is believing! Therefore, we shall "see". Then, we return to Belfast for a **city tour** and time at the **Titanic Museum**. The museum was master-planned over 185 acres of the heritage site where the Titanic was designed and built. Our day concludes as we return to the hotel for dinner and overnight. **[B,D]**

Day 4: Friday 10/21, BELFAST / SLIGO / KNOCK / WESTPORT

We bid farewell to Belfast and drive southwest to Sligo, birthplace of WB Yeats, Ireland's best known poet. Sligo is best known for its spectacular countryside and the town's only surviving medieval structure, **Sligo Abbey**. We visit there before continue to Knock, a humble village whose shrine attracts pilgrims from all over the world, including John Paul II (1979) and Mother Teresa (1993). On August 21, 1879, the eve of the Octave of the Assumption, the parish church of Knock was the scene of a heavenly apparition. The Blessed Mother, St Joseph, St John the Evangelist, and an altar with a Lamb upon it were seen by 15 townspeople. The saints were silent; no message was given to the people, only an example of prayer and a rich symbolism in their appearances. We visit the location of the apparition, the Basilica of Our Lady, and have the opportunity to explore the grounds. From there, we head west into Westport to check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 5: Saturday 10/22, WESTPORT / CRO-AGH PATRICK / KYLEMORE / CONNEMARA / WESTPORT

WESTPORT After breakfast we drive to **Croagh Patrick**, Ireland's Holy Mountain. Here St. Patrick spent the forty days of Lent in the year 441 AD in prayer and fasting. Our journey continues to the shores of Kylemore Lough to visit **Kylemore**, a gothic castle, now a Benedictine Abbey. We enjoy time exploring the Abbey, gardens, and the walk along the lake up to the beautiful chapel. We enjoy sites of the Connemara, characterized by peat bogs, rugged, mountainous terrain and lush countryside that is home to a great variety of wildlife. We return to Westport where the **remainder of the day is free** to explore independently. This evening, wander the streets of Westport and sample authentic Irish fare at the restaurant or pub of your choice as **dinner is** <u>on your own</u>. After dinner, choose from the endless options of pubs occupying every other storefront and enjoy a glass of Guinness or a mug of Irish ale. The city boasts one of the most well-known and visited pubs around, Matt Malloy's. Many of the pubs, including Matt Malloy's, have traditional Irish music and/or dancing as well. Overnight in Westport. **[B]**

Day 6: Sunday 10/23, WESTPORT / CLIFFS OF MO-



HER / ADARE / BUNRATTY / LIMERICK

This morning we depart Westport for the incredible and dramatic **Cliffs of Moher**, where nearly 5 miles of layered black shale and sandstone cliff rock defiantly soars almost 700 feet above the aggressive might of the Atlantic Ocean. The grandeur of this breathtaking natural phenomenon makes it a "must see" for locals and country guests. The best vantage point (weather permitting) is from O'Briens Tower located on the highest cliff. Next, we travel to **Adare**, a beautifully manicured village of thatch-roof cottages. We visit **Holy Trinity Church** and attend **Bunratty Castle's festive Medieval Banquet**, a traditional-Irish dinner experience with story-telling and song. Afterwards, we proceed to Limerick. **(B,D)**



Day 7: Monday 10/24, LIMERICK / GALLARUS ORATORY / SLEA HEAD / DINGLE / LIMERICK

Our day begins with the journey southwest to the **Dingle Peninsula** which thrusts out into the Atlantic Ocean to claim Ireland's most westerly point. Here, majestic hills soar in hues of green and purple over vast bowls of unspoiled valleys. Mountain streams tumble down to lakes, hedgerows blaze with fuchias and golden beaches stretch for miles. The Dingle Peninsula is a place of intense, shifting beauty. We visit **Gallarus Oratory**, an ancient dry stone construction whose longevity testifies to the skill of its builders. Held together completely by the weight of stones (no mortar) the building has withstood wind and rain for more than 1000 years. It is typical of the type of church in which St. Patrick himself worshipped. Then, we wind around the picturesque coast **Slea Head and Dingle**, returning to Limerick for dinner and overnight. **[B,D]**

Day 8: Tuesday 10/25, LIMERICK / ROCK OF CASHEL / KILKENNY / DUBLIN The Rock of Cashel is an im-

The Rock of Casheirs an infinpressive medieval complex called "The Acropolis of Ancient Ireland" and is one of the most spectacular archeological sites in the country. Dating from the 4th century, it was originally used as a fortress. Mighty stone walls encircle a complete round tower, a roofless abbey, a 12th century Romanesque chapel, and numerous other buildings and high crosses. Northeast of the Rock of Cashel is Kilkenny, a charming inland city. Overlooking the River Nore is a famous fortress, **Kilkenny Castle**, which was occupied up until 1935 when the exorbitant


cost of upkeep eventually resulted in the 1967 donation of the castle to the country of Ireland. We visit the castle and also one of the country's medieval treasures, **St. Canice's Cathedral**, that dominates the city skyline. Time permitting, we spend some time at the Kilkenny Design Center which has boasting rights to some of the most magnificent retail goods, including china, crystal, knitwear, Irish jewelry, pottery and so much more. Continuing through the midland counties, our journey today ends in **Dublin**, Ireland's capital city. We check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. **[B,D]**

Day 9: Wednesday 10/26, DUBLIN / GLEN-DALOUGH / DUBLIN

Glendalough (pronounced Glen-dole-lock) is a brief 30mile drive south of Dublin. We visit the **monastic settlement** established in the 6th century by St. Kevin, who was born in 498 of royal blood but rejected his life of privilege to live as a hermit in a cave there. He founded the monastery and also went on to create a center of learning devoted to the care of the sick and the copying and illumination of manuscripts. Amid the ruins, one can feel the powerful sense of peace and tranquility. We return to Dublin, a city known for its modern influences combined with the beauty and heritage of the past. Elegant shops, hotels, galleries, coffee houses and a stunning variety of restaurants have sprung up on almost every street in the capital. The group will enjoy a **city tour**, where we see the statue-lined O'Connell Street, Georgian Squares, Phoenix Park, and St. Patrick's Cathedral. One of Dublin's top tourist attractions, the **Guinness Brewery** will be our last stop. We tour the historical 7-floor building that is continually updated to present guests with a natural balance of industrial tradition coupled with a contemporary flare. The Storehouse also boasts unique merchandise promoting its global, world-famous brand. This evening, indulge in the culinary delights of Ireland at the pub or restaurant of your choosing as <u>dinner is on your</u> **Own**. Overnight in Dublin. **[B]**

Day 10: Thursday 10/27, DUBLIN

Dublin is home to Trinity College which houses the 9th-century "Book of Kells". We visit there and stop to see **St. Mary's Pro Cathedral**. The remainder of the day is free to explore independently. Those interested in souvenir shopping should check out Carroll's as the stores offer a wide selection of merchandise at quite reasonable pric-es. This evening, we meet in the hotel lobby for our transporta-tion to **The Mer**-Ploughboy **Pub** for a festive





farewell dinner to the sounds of traditional Irish music. Overnight in Dublin. **[B,D]**

Day 11: Friday, October 28, 2016, DUBLIN / USA

This morning we begin our journey back to the United States. We take arrive home inspired by holiness of the saints and mesmerized by the pristine beauty of God's majestic landscape. **[B]**
