#### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS / TOUR CONTRACT**

**TOUR PRICE:** Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 11/7/2017 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 41 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge.

**ACCOMMODATIONS:** In first class hotels (except Cruise - XB) or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$89 per night and based on availability. Requests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supplement will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

**MEALS:** Nine full hot breakfasts and eight dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included. Airport fees, departure taxes, and fuel surcharges are estimated on the original invoice and adjusted at the time of ticketing.

**SIGHTSEEING:** By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to avail-

NOT INCLUDED: 1: Airport fees, departure taxes and fuel surcharges (est. - \$499); 2: tips to guides and drivers, meal servers and luggage handlers (\$65 for land services and excursions / tips for services on the cruise portion are to be handled on an individual basis); and 3: optional travel protection. An amount to cover these items will be added to your original invoice. Also not included: domestic baggage fees, passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned and items of a personal nature. Note: Due to limited storage space on motor coaches, Pentecost Tours entitles each passenger to one checked bag and one carry-on bag that meets airline "size/weight" allowances. Domestic baggage fees, overweight baggage charges, and fees for additional bags fall under the responsibility of the passenger. Be aware, while you may agree to pay fees for additional luggage, there may not be room on the motor coach.

**DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION:** A deposit of \$600 per person is required to secure reservations, which sum will be applied to the price of the tour, with the balance to be paid in full no later than 3/9/2018.

- Payment of remaining balance received after 3/9/2018 [PENALTY PHASE ONE] will incur a \$50 penalty. Reservations made within 99 days of departure may be subject to a late charge. In the event of cancellation, refund will be made up to 1/27/2018 with a \$200 administrative fee plus any airline cancellation penalties.
- From 1/27/2018 to 3/9/2018 [PENALTY PHASE TWO] the cancellation penalty is \$600 plus any airline cancellation penalties.
- If cancellation is received after 3/9/2018 [PENALTY PHASE THREE, refund will be subject to a minimum 40% cancellation fee plus any airline cancellation penalties, or an amount equal to expenses to the tour operator, whichever is greater.

There will be no refund for cancellations within 60 days of departure. Cancellation must be in writing and the effective date will be the date that Pentecost Tours, Inc. receives it. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 140 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. **NOTE:** Any change request/alterations to the group flight itinerary, requests for airline

deviations and/or added domestic flights, automatically accelerates to a minimum PHASE TWO penalty level or the current level whichever is greater. Once the change request/alteration is made, those arrangements are final and can NOT be changed back to the group arrangement. If the entire tour is cancelled by Pentecost Tours, Inc., you are entitled to a full refund.

**AIR TRANSPORTATION:** Round trip Chicago/Athens and Athens/Chicago on economy class jet via Turkish or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare, subject to participation of ten persons on entire flight itinerary. If cancellation is effected by passenger after 3/9/2018, or after air tickets are written, whichever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.

**TRAVEL PROTECTION:** Travel Protection is NOT included in the tour price. We highly suggest that all participants purchase a plan to help protect your trip and your investment. Plans offer benefits for trip cancellation/interruption, accident & sickness medical expense, emergency evacuation & repatriation, and more. You will be mailed a travel protection brochure along with a waiver form, in the event that you choose to decline coverage. The Plan Document will be provided, upon purchase. Read through this document carefully as it contains full plan and benefit details and exclusions & limitations. Please note that Medicare does not provide coverage outside of the United States. Day 1: Saturday, June 16, 2018 - USA / ISTANBUL Pilgrims gather this evening at an international airport for our overnight flight to Athens. Meals and beverages are served on board.

Day 2: Sunday 6/17, ISTANBUL / ATHENS Upon arrival in Istanbul, Turkey, we transfer to Athens to check in at our hotel for a welcome dinner and overnight. [D]

Day 3: Monday 6/18, ATHENS / PIRAEUS PORT Today, we proceed to the Piraeus Pier to board our ship. Bon voyage...as we embark on our Aegean cruise visiting the Greek Isles. [B,D]

# Day 4: Tuesday 6/19, CRUISE: KUSADASI-EPHESUS / PATMOS


HOUSE OF MARY





SHORE EXCURSION - ANCIENT EPHESUS AND THE HOUSE OF VIRGIN MARY: Drive through the colorful town of Kusadasi to reach Mt. Koressos. Situated in a small valley, it is here where you will visit the humble chapel which lies on the site of the little house where The Virgin Mary is believed to have spent her last days. Despite the many controversies, the Christian World still favors this belief and the site has been officially sanctioned by the Vatican for pilgrimage. Continue on to Ancient Ephesus and accompanied by your guide, walk through the Magnesian Gate which is the entrance to the ancient city of Ephesus. See the most magnificent excavations in the world. St. Paul's descriptive Letter to the Ephesians (5:21-33) describes the sacred bond between Christ and the Church in a beautiful comparison to that of the bond shared by a husband and his wife. During his three years of residency in Ephesus, Paul meets 12 believers. He baptized them in God's holy name and they received the holy spirit. Next, we walk back to the motor coach along the Arcadian Way, where Mark Anthony and Cleopatra once rode in procession. From there, we sail to Patmos.

SHORE EXCURSION - ST. JOHN MONASTERY AND THE GROTTO IN PATMOS: Depart from the port of Scala and enjoy a short drive to the village of Chora, where the monastery of St. John is built within the walls of a strong fortification. As you walk uphill towards the entrance of the monastery marvel at this magnificent structure, which was built 900 years ago. View the courtyard, the monk's dining room and the old bakery before you visit the main church noted for its outstanding frescoes and interior decoration. Next, visit the small museum where priceless ecclesiastical treasures, books, manuscripts, mosaics, icons, splendid medieval textiles, vestments and jewelry are housed. Return to your motor coach and continue to the nearby Grotto of the Apocalypse and the Monastery of the Apocalypse above it. Walk down the steps to the Grotto of the Apocalypse. Here you will see the niches in the wall that mark the pillow and ledge used as a desk by the author of the Book of the Revelation and the crack in the rock made by the voice of God honoring the Holy Trinity. Afterwards, drive back to the port of Scala and enjoy some free time in this quaint and picturesque town. We board the ship and set sail for Rhodes.




SHORE EXCURSION - RHODES & LINDOS: Drive along the picturesque south-eastern coastline, scattered with white-washed villages, to Lindos, one of the most important of the three great cities of ancient times. See how this entire city is guarded by medieval walls which were constructed by the knights of St. John in the 13th century. Within stands the ancient Acropolis of Lindos, on the brink of a precipice 400 feet above the sea. From the Acropolis, marvel at the breathtaking views covering the great expanse of the Aegean Sea and St. Paul's bay, where the apostle cast anchor during his historic voyage to Ephesus. Proceed on foot uphill, to the great staircase leading from the Hellenistic Portico to the Acropolis and Temple of Athena. Should you wish to make your way up by mule, a fee must be paid to the local muleteer. After your guided tour of the Acropolis, enjoy some free time on your own in Lindos village before meeting up with your motor coach. Return to Rhodes, where Acts 21:1 says St. Paul visited. Enjoy a panoramic drive through the new part of the city before continuing to Mount Smith where you will view the ruins of ancient Rhodes, the Temple of Apollo and Diagoras Stadium. Afterwards your coach will drop you off at Porte d'Amboise for a walking tour through the medieval city of Rhodes. Follow your guide through the northern part where once lived the knights and continue your walk down Chevaliers Road in order to meet up with your motor coach at the marine gate and return back to the ship.

Day 6: Thursday 6/21, CRUISE: CRETE-HERAKLION / SANTORINI

SHORE EXCURSION - KNOSSOS PALACE & MUSEUM IN HERAKLION: Crete is the largest and the most rugged of the Greek islands. En route from Jerusalem to Rome, St. Paul was forced to anchor here for a few weeks because of a hurricane. During his stay, he preached to the natives. Crete is also the home of the great Minoan Civilization and the mythological home of Zeus. After a short drive through the town of Heraklion the tour will arrive at Knossos excavations. Here, Sir Arthur Evan's archaeological discoveries revealed a civilization dating back to 4000 BC, when a great empire flourished on the island of Crete. Based on the wealth of artifacts that were found, Evans theorized that this was the site of the ancient Minoan Kingdom. These findings will be viewed in detail, as your guide will lead you on a journey of discovery to learn of the sophisticated culture that flourished thousands of years ago on this island. The tour will continue to the Museum of Heraklion which houses the treasures from the findings of Knossos, Phaestos, Zakros and others less known cities.

#### SHORE EXCURSION - SANTORINI: Explore the



island on your own. It was here where Paul received an unheeded warning about his efforts to continue spreading his Christian beliefs. The island of Santorini is perhaps the most breath-

taking of all Greek islands. The white-washed houses, the narrow streets, the open-air cafes and boutiques of sparkling white of Fira village cling to steep cliffs, accesible by foot, cable-car or mule. From this extraordinary natural promontory, Santorini will offer you the greatest view on the largest active caldera of the world, where, according to the legend, the lost continent of Atlantis has been swallowed up. In the south there is Akrotiri where you can find recent Minoan excavations. We board the ship and set sail for our return to the Piraeus Port.

## Day 7: Friday 6/22 CRUISE ENDS / PIRAEUS PORT / ATHENS



Early this morning our ship docks at the **port of Piraeus.** After we disembark, we **tour Athens**, beginning with a visit to the **Acropolis.** The Greek word "acropolis" is used in a broad sense to designate the forti-

fied height of a city. On the Acropolis of Athens is the famous **Parthenon** (the main temple of Athena). We continue down to explore the **Ancient Agora**. Next we visit **Mars Hill**, the site where St. Paul expounded the subject of monotheism before the pagan Greeks (this address is recorded in Acts 17:22-31). We also visit **Hadrian's Arch** 

and the Modern Olympiad Stadium (if open) before returning to our hotel for dinner and overnight. [D]

Day 8: Saturday 6/23, ATHENS / CORINTH / ATHENS Today we travel from Athens to the Peloponnesian Peninsula. The Peninsula is connected to the main body of Greece by the Isthmus of Corinth, We cross the Isthmus to the town of the same name, where Paul lived and worked for two years after leaving Athens. The account of the foundation of the Christian Church here by Paul, the Apostle and Patron Saint of Corinth, can be read in Acts 22. We view the excavations, the Bema Seat, and the museum. We return to Athens for a night tour of the city and We return to Athens for a night tour of the city and a sound and light show before continuing to a typical Greek Taverna for dinner. Day 9: Sunday 6/24, ATHENS / flight / ISTANBUL
This morning, we proceed to the airport for our departing
flight into Instanbul. Upon our arrival, we take a sightseeing drive through the business centre of the modern
city, across the Galata Bridge, along the banks of the Golden Horn and under the Byzantine Aqueduct of Valens. On
the way, you can see the Suleymaniye Mosque, dedicated to Sultan Suleyman the Magnificent. Continue around
the mighty city walls which once protected Constantings. ed to Sulfan Suleyman the Magnificent. Continue around the mighty city walls, which once protected Constantinople from the many invasions and attacks it suffered over the centuries. In the Old City, the first visit will be to the Byzantine Hippodrome, which was once one of the largest chariot race arenas in the Byzantine Empire. Then, we visit the **Sultanahmet Mosque**, where large groups of pilgrims start their pilgrimage to Mecca. It is decorated with 21,000 blue Iznik tiles from where it gets its name, the "Blue Mosque". Walk to the **world famous monument of Hagia Sophia**, the Byzantine Church of Divine Wisdom, where you can see the superb mosaics and the marble decorations. Our day concludes as we proceed to our hotel to check in for a farewell dinner and overnight. **IB.DI** tel to check in for a farewell dinner and overnight. [B,D]



Day 10: Monday 6/25 ISTANBUL
On our last day of pilgrimage, we tour the Topkapi Palace, the official residence of the Ottoman Sultans. See the famous treasury and the "Spoonmaker's Diamond", one of the largest diamonds in the world. Visit the kitchen buildings, displaying the third richest collection in the world of Chinese and Japanese porcelain. The remainder of the day is free to explore on your own. This evening, enjoy authentic local cuisine as dinner is on your own.
