TERMS AND CONDITIONS / TOUR CONTRACT

TOUR PRICE: Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 8/15/2018 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 36 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge.

ACCOMMODATIONS: In first class hotels (except Cruise - XA) or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$89 per night for the land portion and based on availability. Note: Single rooms are unavailable on the cruise portion. Requests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supplement will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

MEALS: Ten full hot breakfasts, lunches on the cruise portion, and ten dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included. Airport fees, departure taxes, fuel surcharges and cruise port taxes are estimated on the original invoice and adjusted at the time of ticketing.

SIGHTSEEING: By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to availability.

NOT INCLUDED: •: Airport fees, departure taxes and fuel surcharges (est. - \$559); •: tips to guides and drivers, meal servers and luggage handlers (\$158.50); •: cruise taxes (est.-\$169); and •: optional travel protection. An amount to cover these items will be added to your original invoice. Also not included: airline baggage fees, passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned and items of a personal nature. NOTE: Due to limited storage space on motor coaches, Pentecost Tours entitles each passenger to one checked bag and one carry-on bag that meets airline "size/weight" allowances. Baggage fees, overweight baggage charges, and fees for additional bags fall under the responsibility of the passenger. Be aware, while you may agree to pay fees for additional luggage, there may not be room on the motor coach.

ASSISTANCE: Pilgrims who require personal assistance must be accompanied by a paying passenger who will provide that assistance.

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION: A deposit of \$600 per person is required to secure reservations, which sum will be applied to the price of the tour, with the balance to be paid in full no later than 7/8/2019. Payment of remaining balance received after 7/8/2019 will incur a \$50 penalty. Reservations made within 92 days of departure may be subject to a late charge.

► In the event of cancellation, refund will be made up to 5/31/2019 [PENALTY PHASE ONE] with a \$150 administrative fee plus any airline cancellation penalties.

From 5/31/2019 to 7/8/2019 [PENALTY PHASE TWO] the cancellation penalty is \$600 plus any airline cancellation penalties.

▶If cancellation is received after 7/8/2019 [PENALTY PHASE THREE], refund will be subject to a minimum 40% cancellation fee plus any airline cancellation penalties, or an amount equal to expenses to the tour operator, whichever is greater.

There will be no refund for cancellations within 60 days of departure.

Cancellation must be in writing and the effective date will be the date that Pentecost Tours, Inc. receives it. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 130 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. If the entire tour is cancelled by Pentecost Tours, Inc., you are entitled to a full refund.

NOTE: Any change request/alterations to the group flight itinerary, requests for airline deviations and/or added domestic flights, automatically accelerates to a minimum PHASE TWO penalty level or the current level whichever is greater. Once the change request/alteration is made, those arrangements are final and can NOT be changed back to the group arrangement.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round trip USA/Thessaloniki and Athens/USA on economy class jet via Turkish or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare, subject to participation of ten persons on entire flight itinerary. If cancellation is effected by passenger after 7/8/2019, or after air tickets are written, whichever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.

TRAVEL PROTECTION: Travel Protection is NOT included in the tour price. We highly suggest that all participants purchase a plan to help protect your trip and your investment. Plans offer benefits for trip cancellation/interruption, accident & sickness medical expense, emergency evacuation & repatriation, and more. You will be mailed a travel protection brochure along with a waiver form, in the event that you choose to decline coverage. The Plan Document carefully as it contains full plan and benefit details and exclusions & limitations. Please note that Medicare does not provide coverage outside of the United States. Check with your own insurance provider to determine whether or not you are covered outside of the U.S.

MASS WILL BE **CELEBRATED DAILY**



Day 1: Tuesday, October 8, 2019, USA / ISTANBUL

Pilgrims gather this evening for our overnight flight to Istănbul. Meals and beverages are served on board.

Day 2: Wednesday 10/9, INSTANBUL / THESSALONIKI

Upon our arrival in Istanbul, we board our connecting flight to Thessaloniki, Greece's second largest city and the birthplace of Aristotle. Upon our arrival, we enjoy a brief orientation tour before checking in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [D]

Day 3: Thursday 10/10, THESSALONIKI / PHILIPPI / THESSALONIKI

Today, we enjoy a day trip to Philippi, a city named after Philip of Macedonia, father of Alexander the Great. Philippi was the first European town to hear the preach-ing of St Paul. Paul, Timothy, and Luke were able to make many converts among the Philippians, especially among those of rank. We'll visit the **legendary prison** of St. Paul, the theatre, Forum and St. Lydia's Baptis-tery before returning to Thessaloniki for dinner and an overnight. [B,D]

Day 4: Friday 10/11, THESSALONIKI / KALAMBAKA



This mornina we have free time to explore on our own or shop in Thessa-Ioniki. Suggestions inčlude: a visit to either of the main squares located on the waterfront: Platia Elefterias or Platia

Aristotelous. Both areas are full of cafes and restaurants and provide an ideal environment in which to relax and soak up the bustling activity of the city. This afternoon, we visit the **Rotonda**, **Triumphal Arch of Galerius, the** sea front and the White Tower before making our way to Kalambaka to check in at our hotel and freshen up for dinner. Overnight in Kalambaka. [B,D]

Day 5: Saturday 10/12, KALAMBAKA / DELPHI

Today, we begin in Kalambaka, where we visit the architectural wonder of Meteora Monasteries, prominently perched atop soaring cliffs. Next, we set off for the city of **Delphi** via the National Highway. References are made to Delphi in connection with Apollo in such literary works as the Iliad, the Odyssey, and Oedipus Rex. Upon arrival in Delphi, we have an orientation tour of the city before checking in at our hotel for dinner and an overnight. [B,D]

Day 6: Sunday 10/13, DELPHI / ATHENS

Our first stop today is the **ruins** of Delphi that were once the famed Temple of Apollo. From there, we make a brief stop at the nearby Theatre, Athenian the Treasury, and the Castalian **Spring**. We con-tinue to the **Mu**-



seum of Delphi to view some of the treasures. Housed in the museum are the Charioteer (a famous statue), the Naxian Sphinx, and the Statue of Antinoos. Next, we board our motor coach and make our way to Athens. Upon our arrival there, we enjoy a panoramic tour, beginning with Hadrian's Arch and a view of the Royal Palace, the Stadium, the Temple of Zeus, and the Theatre of Dionysius. We visit Mars Hill, the site where St. Paul expounded the subject of monotheism before the pagan Greeks (this address is recorded in Acts 17:22-31). We visit the Acropolis and the museum. The Greek word "acropolis" is used in a broad sense to designate the fortified height of a city. Located on the Acropolis of Athens is the famous Parthenon (the main temple of Athena). *Time permitting*, we walk down to explore the Ancient Agora and the ruins of the prison where Socrates was held and ultimately carried out his death sentence by drinking hemlock poison. (Please note: this pedestrian area would add a great deal of ad-ditional walking). We will proceed to our hotel to check in for dinner and an overnight. **[B,D]**

Day 7: Monday 10/14, ATHENS/ PIRAEUS / MYKONOS

This morning, we board our ship at the Piraeus pier for an Aegean cruise. Once we set sail, our first stop is the picturesque, 29-square-mile island of **Mykonos**, known for its narrow, winding paths, windmills, and over 350 tiny chapels that beautifully paint the island's characteristically blue and white canvas. We enjoy some free time to wander its streets, browse the many shops near the harbor, or relax and enjoy the breathtaking view. We return to the ship to set sail for Kusadasi, Turkey. [B]

Day &: Tuesday 10/15, KUSADASI (EPHESUS) / PATMOS SHORE EXCURSION - ANCIENT EPHESUS AND THE HOUSE OF VIRGIN MARY: Drive through the colorful town of Kusadasi to reach Mt. Koressos. Situated in a small valley, it is here you will visit the humble chapel which lies on the site of the little house where The Virgin Mary is believed to have spent her last days. Despite the many controversies, the Christian World still favors this belief and the site has been officially sanctioned by the Vatican for pilgrimage. Continue on to Ancient Ephesus



and accompanied by your quide, walk through the Magnesian Gate which is the entrance to the ancient city of Ephesus. See the most magnificent excavations in

the world. St. Paul's descriptive Letter to the Ephesians (5:21-33) describes the sacred bond between Christ and the Church in a beautiful comparison to that of the bond shared by a husband and his wife. During his three years of residency in Ephesus, Paul meets 12 believers. He baptized them in God's holy name and they received the Holy Spirit. Next, we walk back to the motor coach along the Arcadian Way, where Mark Anthony and Cleopatra once rode in procession. From there, we sail to Patmos.



SHORE EXCURSION - ST. JOHN MONASTERY AND THE GROTTO IN PATMOS: Depart from the port of Scala and enjoy a short drive to the village of Chora , where the monastery of St. John is built within the walls of a strong fortification. As you walk uphill towards the entrance of the monastery, marvel at this magnificent structure, which was built 900 years ago. View the courtyard, the monk's dining room and the old bakery before you visit the main church, noted for its outstanding frescoes and interior decoration. Next, visit the small museum where priceless ecclesiastical treasures, books, manuscripts, mosaics, icons, splendid medieval textiles, vestments and jewelry are housed. Return to your motor coach and continue to the nearby Grotto of the Apocalypse and the Monastery of the Apocalypse above it. Walk down the steps to the Grotto of the Apocalypse. Here you will see the niches in the wall that mark the pillow and ledge used as a desk by the author of the Book of the Revelation, and the crack in the rock made by the voice of God honoring the Holy Trinity. Afterwards, drive back to the port of Scala and enjoy some free time in this quaint and picturesque town.

We board the ship and set sail for Rhodes.

Day 9: Wednesday 10/16, RHODES / LINDOS SHORE EXCURSION - RHODES & LINDOS: Drive along the picturesque south-eastern coastline, scattered with white-washed villages, to Lindos, one of the most im-portant of the three great cities of ancient times. See how this entire city is guarded by medieval walls which were constructed by the Knights of St. John in the 13th century. Within stands the ancient Acropolis of Lindos, on the brink of a precipice 400 feet above the sea. From the Acropolis, marvel at the breathtaking views covering the great expanse of the Aegean Sea and St. Paul's bay, where the apostle cast anchor during his historic voyage to Ephesus. Proceed on foot uphill, to the great staircase to Ephesus. Proceed on foot uphil, to the great staircase leading from the Hellenistic Portico to the Acropolis and Temple of Athena. Should you wish to make your way up by mule, a fee must be paid to the local muleteer. After your guided tour of the Acropolis, enjoy some free time on your own in Lindos village before meeting up with your motor coach. Return to Rhodes, where Acts 21:1 says St. Paul visited. Enjoy free time to explore the old city of Rhodes. In the walls, you will go through D'Amboi-se Gate to walk on the Street of the Knights. Along this street you will find the residences of the Knights. Along this street you will find the residences of the Knights, separated according to Order, which bear their corresponding

crests. Return on your own to the ship, which is just out of the walls.

Day 10: Thursday 10/17, HERAKLION (CRETE) / SANTORINI SHORE EXCURSION - KNOSSOS PALACE & MUSEUM IN

HERAKLION: Crete is the largest and the most rugged of the Greek islands. En route from Jerusalem to Rome, St. Paul was forced to anchor here for a few weeks because of a hurricane. During his stay, he preached to the natives. Crete is also the home of the great Minoan Civilization and the mythological home of Zeus. After a short drive through the town of Heraklion, the tour will arrive at Knossos excavations. Here, Sir Arthur Evan's archaeological discoveries revealed a civilization dating back to 4000 BC, when a great empire flourished on the island of Crete. Based on the wealth of artifacts that were found, Evans theorized that this was the site of the ancient Minoan Kingdom. These findings will be viewed in detail, as your guide will lead you on a journey of discovery to learn of the sophisticated culture that flourished thousands of years ago. The tour will continue to the Museum of Heraklion which houses the treasures from the findings of Knossos, Phaestos, Zakros and other lesser known cities.

SHORE EXCURSION - SANTORINI: Explore the island on your own. It was here where Paul received an unheeded warning about his efforts to continue spreading his Christian beliefs. The island of Santorini is perhaps the most breathtaking of all Greek islands. The whitewashed houses, the narrow streets, the open-air cafes and boutiques of sparkling white of Fira village cling to steep cliffs, accesible by foot, cable-car (optional \$80) or mule. From this extraordinary natural promontory, Santorini will offer you the greatest view on the largest active caldera of the world,



where, according to the legend, the lost continent of Atlantis has been swallowed up. In the south is Akrotiri, where you can find recent Minoan excavations. We board the ship and set sail for our **return to the Piraeus Port.** To Register:

We cross the Isthmus to the town of the same name, where Paul lived and worked for two years after leaving Athens. The account of the foundation of the Christian Church here by Paul, the Apostle and Patron Saint of Corinth, can be read in Acts 22. We view the excavations, the Bema Seat, and the museum. We return to Athens for a night tour of the city and a sound and light show before continuing to a typical Greek Taverna for dinner. Overnight in Athens. [B,D]

Day 12: Saturday, October 19, 2019, ATHENS / USA We bid farewell to Greece and begin our journey back
