TERMS AND CONDITIONS / TOUR CONTRACT

TOUR PRICE: Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 5/25/2020 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 41 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge.

ACCOMMODATIONS: In first class hotels or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$99 per night and based on availability. Category 1 Play tickets in Oberammergau. Requests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supplement will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

MEALS: Ten full hot breakfasts, one lunch, and eight dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included. Airport fees, departure taxes, and fuel surcharges are estimated on the original invoice and adjusted at the time of ticketing.

SIGHTSEEING: By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to availability.

NOT INCLUDED: •: Airport fees, departure taxes, and fuel surcharges (est. - \$559), **•** tips to guides, drivers, and meal servers (\$170) and **•**: optional travel protection. An amount to cover these three items will be added to your original invoice. Also not included: passport and visa fees, luggage handlers, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned, items of a personal nature, and excess baggage.

NOTE: Due to limited storage space on motor coaches, Pentecost Tours entitles each passenger to one checked bag and one carry-on bag that meets airline "size/weight" allowances. Baggage fees, overweight baggage charges, and fees for additional bags fall under the responsibility of the passenger. Be aware, while you may agree to pay fees for additional luggage, there may not be room on the motor coach.

ASSISTANCE: Pilgrims who require personal assistance must be accompanied by a paying passenger who will provide that assistance.

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION: A deposit of \$1,000 per person is required to secure reservations. An additional \$1,500 is due by May 1, 2021, and another \$1,000 is due 12/1/2021 which sums will be applied to the price of the tour with the **balance to be paid in full no later than 4/19/2022.** Payment of remaining balance received after 4/19/2022 will incur a \$100 penalty. Reservations made within 145 days of departure may be subject to a late charge.

▶ [PHASE ONE] CANCELLATION: In the event of cancellation, refund will be made up to 5/1/2021 with a \$500 administrative fee plus any airline cancellation penalties.

▶ [PHASE TWO] CANCELLATION: From 5/1/2021 to 12/1/2021 the cancellation penalty is \$1,600 plus any airline cancellation penalties.

▶ [PHASE THREE] CANCELLATION: If cancellation is received after 12/1/2021, refund will be subject to a minimum 50% cancellation fee plus any airline cancellation penalties mentioned below, or an amount equal to expenses to the tour operator, whichever is greater.

► There will be no refund for cancellations within 95 days of departure.

Credit card processing fees are non-refundable. Cancellation must be in writing and the effective date will be the date that Pentecost Tours, Inc. receives it. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 120 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. If the entire tour is cancelled by Pentecost Tours, Inc., you are entitled to a full refund.

NOTE: Any change request/alterations to the group flight itinerary, requests for airline deviations and/or added domestic flights, automatically accelerates to a minimum PHASE TWO penalty level or the current level whichever is greater. Once the change request/ alteration is made, those arrangements are final and can NOT be changed back to the group arrangement.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round trip Wash Dulles or Baltimore/ Milan and Munich/Wash Dulles or Baltimore on economy class jet via Delta, United or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare, subject to participation of ten persons on entire flight itinerary. If cancellation is effected by passenger after 12/1/2021, or after air tickets are written, whichever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.

Day 1: Friday, September 9, 2022, USA / MILAN

Tour members are welcomed at an international airport for our departing flight to Milan via wide-bodied aircraft, arriving the next day. Meals are served on board.

Day 2: Saturday 9/10, MILAN Upon our arrival in Milan, Italy, we will stop to visit the **Duomo**, located in the heart of the city. This gothic ca-thedral is one of the largest in the world. Construction began in the 14th century and took over 500 years to complete. The 135 spires on its roof make this cathedral a memorable and extraordinary site. St. Ambrose was a bishop of Milan and in the 4th century became one of the most influential religious figures of his time. He was the first of the four original doctors of the Church. We also visit the **excavation below the church** where it is believed that St. Ambrose baptized St. Augustine once St. Augustine was converted to the faith. Then, we will proceed to our hotel to check in for a welcome dinner and overnight. [D]



BLESSED FRASSATI

Day 3: Sunday 9/11, MILAN / TURIN / MILAN Today we take a day trip southwest **to Turin**. Upon our arrival, we travel on foot to **visit the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist (Cathedral of Turin)**. This cathe-dral houses the Shroud of Turin (not available for public viewing) and is the burial place of Turin-native Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-1925), avid athlete, benefac-tor of the poor, and "saint" for our modern world and for young people. In 1981 his remains were discovered to be incorrupt and were transferred from the Frassati to be incorrupt and were transferred from the Frassati family tomb in nearby Pollone to the Cathedral in Tu-rin. Then, we visit the **Basilica of Maria Ausiliatrice (Our Lady Help of Christians)** where the body of St. John Bosco is kept in a glass reliquary. John Bosco, born 200 years ago in a place not far from Turin, became a priest and developed a great empathy for the problems of young people. He founded the Salesian Congrega-tion at Turin in 1864 and later added the Institute of the Daughters of Mary Our Lady Help of Christians to the male congregation. Within a few years, his intensely dedicated effort created a network of world-renowned homes, academic centers, laboratories and recreation homes in Italy and abroad. St John Bosco is known as the patron saint of apprentices, boys, editors, Mexican youth, laborers, schoolchildren, and young people in general. Next, we visit **Piazza San Carlo**, **Po Street**, and **Mount of the Capuchin Monks**. From there, we return the outpatrol in the second excerning the **TB DI** to our hotel in Milan for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 4: Monday 9/12, MILAN / DESENZANO DEL GARDA

Our day begins at Santa Maria delle Grazie to see one of the key images of western civilization, Leonardo da Vinci's Last Supper. Then, there will be time for **shop**ping at the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II. Then, we bid farewell to Milan and make our way toward Sirmione, on the southern shore of Lake Garda._ We check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. **[B,D**]

Day 5: Tuesday 9/13, DESENZANO DEL GARDA / SIRMIONE / DESENZANO DEL GARDA

We awaken today to the beauty of lake country and the thriving **lake town of Sirmione**. On a peninsula, Sirmione boasts wonderful lakeside markets, shops, and eateries that make the streets lively and fun. We will visit the famous 13th-century majestic Scaligeri Castle. Then, we have free time to explore on our own. Suggestions include:

- An optional boat excursion to view the castles and villas on Lake Garda. Your tour escort can provide you with information about the boat fee and boarding times.
- Stroll through the archeological museum and/or the Roman ruins (1st-century AD) of Grotte di Catullo.
- Stop in to pray at one or two of the local churches.
- Wine lovers may want to visit Sirmione's Ca dei Frati Vineyard for a tour of the cellar and to learn about their process of vino production. The tour ends with the opportunity for guests to sample and/or buy from the vineyard's selection of fine wines.

This evening, indulge in some local favorites as **dinner is** on our own. We return to our hotel in Desenzano del Garda. [B]



Day 6: Wednesday 9/14, DESENZANO DEL GARDA / INNSBRUCK

As we depart Sirmione and proceed north parallel to the eastern shore of Lake Garda, we will notice the Mount Baldo mountain range, steep limestone slopes, and the pastures that meet at the foothills. Olive groves and vineyards are plentiful as well. We cross the border into Austria. Innsbruck, Austria, a two-time host of the Win-ter Olympics and cultural center 800 years in the making, is home to some of the most spectacular architectural treasures tucked deep within the Alps. Upon our arrival, we take a **tour** of the magical city of Innsbruck. We **view** the renowned Golden Roof, a three-tier balcony constructed of gold that decorates the front of the "Neuhof," which means New Court. The historical landmark was built to honor the union of Emperor Maximilian I and his wife Bianca and served as their luxurious royal seat to observe activities and tournaments in the square below. From there, we enjoy a **guided tour of the 15th-cen-tury Imperial Palace (Hofburg)**. Then, this evening we sample the **Tyrolean folklore experience**, which includes dinner: traditional dancing, yodeling, and a performance on the alphorn. Overnight in Innsbruck. [B,D]

Day 7: Thursday 9/15, INNSBRUCK / KONNIGSSEE / INNSBRUCK

We tour the medieval, picturesque Maria Theresienstrasse walking route and enjoy a guided tour of Ambras Castle, built in the 16th century by Archduke Ferdinand I. The castle was built in the remains of a medieval fortress. Then, we and travel to Könnigssee, Germany on the German-Austrian border. Könnigssee, located on the southeastern tip of Germany, is a beautiful, clear em-erald-green lake that Bavaria boasts is the cleanest in all of Germany. History indicates that glaciers formed the lake during the last ice age. The steep, mountainous alpine backdrop makes this a fjord-like lake that promises impressive photo opportunites to all who behold it. We return to Innsbruck for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 8: Friday 9/16, INNSBRUCK / OBERAMMERGAU



Today we travel to Oberammergau for Mass, a group lunch and some free time. Oberammergau is a beautiful Bavarian village of craftsmen who host the world famous Passion Festival once every decade ever since the original performance in 1634. t is important to note the importance of the play and the reason the village goes to ex-traordinary measures to re-enact Christ's Passion. After a black plague epidemic in the 17th century miraculously ended earlier than expected, the natives vowed to

produce the festival with amateur actors from the village. Natives of Oberammergau put on an incredible, unforget-table performance in their 5,200-seat Passion Play Theatre. We are blessed to have **premium reserved-seats to expe-rience the Passion Play today**. Although the play is spoken in German, a full English translation is available so you can follow along from your seat. The opening scene begins at 2:30 PM. There is a three-hour intermission from 5-8 PM. Part II begins at 8 PM and concludes at 10:30 PM. Breakfast, lunch, and overnight in Garmisch. [B,L]

Day 9: Saturday 9/17, GARMISCH / SALZBURG We depart Garmisch and proceed to the "City of Music" and birthplace of Mozart, lovely Salzburg, Austria. Upon our arrival, we might hear the bells of the great Glocken-spiel Tower, performed to a melody of Mozart's. We stop at Hellbrunn Palace to enjoy its gardens and hidden trick fountains before continuing to view some of the city's great houses, mansions, Festival Hall, and the Mirabelle Gardens. Next, we visit the Romanesque Cathedral, view the Nonnberg Convent of Benedictine nurs, and view the Nonberg Convent of Benedictine nuns, and the Fortress Hohensalzburg. Today's touring concludes as we enjoy a Mozart Dinner Concert in the Baroque Hall of the Stiffskeller St Peter. We will listen to the most pop-ular compositions of Mozart by candlelight; the music will be played by Salzburg artists dressed in historic costumes. The evening includes a multiple-course dinner, prepared according to traditional recipes from the 17th and 18th centuries. Dinner and overnight in Salzburg. **[B,D]**

Day 10: Sunday 9/18, SALZBURG / MUNICH This morning we visit **St. Peter's Monastery and St. Peter's Churchyard**. Then, we bid farewell to Salzburg and venture northwest **to Munich, Germany** often referred to as the "secret capital" when Bonn was still Germany's official cap-ital city. We have an **orientation tour of the city**, check in at our hotel, and the **remainder of the day is free** to ex-plore independently, shop for souvenirs, take a city tour or sit and enjoy the Bavarian culture. This evening, we gather for **dinner at the world-famous <u>Hofbrauhaus</u>**. Overnight in Munich (B D) in Munich. [B,D]

Day 11: Monday 9/19, MUNICH Munich sightseeing is planned for today. We begin at the Gothic Frauenkirche Cathedral (Church of Our Lady), with its towering twin-onion domed steeple that has served as the symbol of Munich for centuries. From there, we visit Asamkirch (the Church of St. Johann Nepomuk), one of the most richly decorated rococo (Bavarian late-Baroque ar-chitecture) churches in the world. The remains of St. Johann Nepomuk are enshrined in a glass crypt within the church. Next, we proceed to the Nymphenburg Palace, former summer residence of

summer residence of the rulers of Bavaria and present residence and chancery for the head of the house of Wittelsbach (currently the Duke of Bavaria). This evening, our coach will drop us off at **Okto-berfest**, the world's largest folk festival.

Since the birth of the festival in 1810, Oktoberfest has and evolved over the years to be the popular German festival it is today. Annually the festival continues to break chicken-eat-ing and beer-drinking records. The festival offers something for evolver for everyone: rides, popular Bavarian specialties, tradition-al German music and dancing, and millions of people sporting dirndl dresses or lederhosen. If you enjoy local Oktoberfest cel-

overnight in Munich. **[B,D]**

Day 12: Tuesday, September 20, 2022, MUNICH / USA Today, we begin our journey back to the U.S. We arrive home with unforgettable memories of the grandeur of God's breathtaking landscape and the beautiful exam-ple of love shown for God by the people of the village of Oberammergau. [B]
