TOUR PRICE: Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 12/28/2021 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 36 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge.

ACCOMMODATIONS: In first class hotels or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$89 per night and based on availability. Requests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supplement will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

MEALS: Ten full hot breakfasts and ten dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included. Airport fees, departure taxes, and fuel surcharges are estimated on the original invoice and adjusted at the time of ticketing.

SIGHTSEEING: By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to availability.

NOT INCLUDED: ①: Airport fees, departure taxes and fuel surcharges (est. - \$569); **②**: tips to guides, drivers and meal servers (\$166); and **③**: optional travel protection. **An amount to cover these items will be added to your original invoice.** Also not included: airline baggage fees, luggage handlers, passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned and items of a personal nature.

NOTE: Due to limited storage space on motor coaches, Pentecost Tours entitles each passenger to one checked bag and one carry-on bag that meets airline "size/weight" allowances. Baggage fees, overweight baggage charges, and fees for additional bags fall under the responsibility of the passenger. Be aware, while you may agree to pay fees for additional luggage, there may not be room on the motor coach.

ASSISTANCE: Pilgrims who require personal assistance must be accompanied by a paying passenger who will provide that assistance.

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION: A deposit of \$500 per person is required to secure reservations, which sum will be applied to the price of the tour, with the **balance to be paid in full no later than 11/2/2022.** Payment of remaining balance received after 11/2/2022 will incur a \$50 penalty and/or a delay in your final travel documents. Reservations made within 96 days of departure may be subject to a late charge.

Credit card processing fees are non-refundable. Cancellation must be in writing and the effective date will be the date that Pentecost Tours, Inc. receives it. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 120 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. If the entire tour is cancelled by Pentecost Tours, Inc., you are entitled to a full refund.

NOTE: Any change request/alterations to the group flight itinerary, requests for airline deviations and/or added domestic flights, automatically advances into the next penalty level or the current level whichever is greater. Once the change request/ alteration is made, those arrangements are final and can NOT be changed back to the group arrangement.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round trip Chicago/Tel Aviv and Tel Aviv/Chicago on economy class jet via Turkish or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare, subject to participation of ten persons on entire flight itinerary. If cancellation is effected by passenger after 11/2/2022, or after air tickets are written, whichever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.



Day 1: Monday, February 6, 2023, CHICAGO / TEL AVIV

Tour members are welcomed at an international airport for our departing flight to Tel Aviv via wide-body aircraft, arriving the next day. Meals served on board.



Day 2: Tuesday, 02/07, TEL AVIV / JOPPA / CAESAR-EA MARITIMA / MT CARMEL / TIBERIAS

Upon arrival in Tel Aviv, we board our motor coach for our first sights of Israel. We proceed to **Jaffa** (biblical our first sights of Israel. We proceed to Jaffa (biblical Joppa), the ancient port city where Peter sees a vision that all foods are clean, the start of the Gentile Mission, and where Jonah left prior to being swallowed by the whale. It was also here that Peter had his house-top ex-perience. We visit the **house and Church of St. Peter**. Heading north along the Mediterranean is **Caesarea Maritima**, where St. Paul was imprisoned, tried, and sent from this Mediterranean harbor to Rome. This is our next stop. We visit one of Herod the Great's palaces and see the **ruins of the ancient amphitheater** next to the see the **ruins of the ancient amphitheater** next to the ocean. We journey north to the Stella Maris, **Our Lady of Mount Carmel** and the home of the prophet, Elijah in Haifa. From there, we complete today's journey as we travel to Tiberias to check in at our hotel for a welcome dinner and overnight. [D]

Day 3: Wednesday, 02/08, TIBERIAS / MAGDALA / MT OF BEATITUDES / SEA OF GALILEE / TIBERIAS Today we visit Magdala, birthplace and home of Mary Magdalene, a witness to the resurrection. We spend time at **Duc in Altum Church**, a new and quite unique spiritual center. To commemorate Jesus preaching from the boat, Duc in Altum Church has coupled the boat-shaped altar in the church with the beautiful Sea of Galilee backdrop to bring history back to life. Other features of the church include: an atrium dedicated to the women of the church who followed Jesus, a mosaics chapel, and the Encounter Chapel with its floor from the original first-century market place of the Magdala port. Once a frontrunner in first century culture, in **Magdala's ar**cheological park you can see mikvaot (ritual baths) that are more sophisticated than others from its period. The oldest synagogue in Galilee was also excavated in Magdala. As it exists in such a well preserved state from the time of Christ's teaching, much information could be extracted and shared. An ancient coin found in the syn-agogue during excavation has been determined to be agogue during excavation has been determined to be from the time of Christ's ministry. Also unearthed was a marketplace on what was once the trade route that has been able to tell archeologists a great deal about life in Magdala and its role in ancient history. The **Mount of Beatitudes**, site of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount is our next stop. We relax and enjoy tranguil and contemplative time before our **boat ride on the Sea of Galilee**. We return to Tiberias for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 4: Thursday, 02/09, TIBERIAS / CANA / SEPPHO-RIS / NAZARETH / TIBERIAS

We board our motor coach today and proceed to Cana where Jesus performed His first miracle, changing water where Jesus performed His first miracle, changing water into wine. From there, we stop in **Sepphoris**, location where Joachim and Anna lived. We view the mosa-ics. Then, we proceed to **Nazareth**, where Jesus played, grew up amongst the other children of the city, and later worked with Joseph in carpentry. It is here in the **Church** of the Annunciation just behind the altar where you can see the grotto where Mary said "yes" to the angel of the Lord. We visit **St. Joseph's carpentry shop**, the Church of **St. Joseph, and Mary's well.** Finally, we return to our hotel for dinger and overnight in Tiberias. **IB D1** hotel for dinner and overnight in Tiberias. Day 5: Friday, 02/10, TIBERIAS / CAESAREA PHILIPPI / CAPERNAUM / TABGHA / PETER'S PRIMACY / SEA OF GALILEE / TIBERIAS

We venture north to visit **Caesarea Philippi**, just north of the Sea of Galilee and at the base of Mt. Herman. It is here you will see one of the main springs of the Jordan River. Caesarea Philippi, also called "Banias", is the location of the testimony of St. Peter and where Jesus answered him, "You are the Rock and upon this rock I will build my Church." During our visit, we will **see one** of the three springs that feeds the Jordan River. On our way back toward Tiberias, we stop in **Capernaum**. This is the town where Peter lived and within which Jesus made his base of operations for His Galilean ministry. As we visit the **ruins of the town** you will find out why Jesus focused his ministry here, where ancient Judaism flourished. We will **visit the Synagogue** where Jesus healed and taught, and also **Peter's house**. Nearby, we stop at **Tabgha**, location of the miracle of the loaves and fish and the **Church of St. Peter's Primacy**, where Jesus appeared after the Pecureration. We return to our beto appeared after the Resurrection. We return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

MT TABOR

Day 6: Saturday, 02/11, TIBERIAS / MT TABOR / JER-ICHO / QSAR EL YAHUD / MT OF TEMPTATIONS / MT SCOPUS / JERUSALEM

The first part of our day will be spent at **Mt. Tabor**, site of the Transfiguration. The church has two altars: one dedicated to the symbolism of Our Lord on earth and the other is dedicated to Jesus in Heaven. From there, travelling south parallel to the Jordan River, we stop in **Jericho**, the world's oldest city. Next, we stop at **Qasar El Yahud**, the actual site where Jesus was baptized in the River Jordan, is nearby and we stop there to renew our baptismal promises. Then, we take the cable car to the top of the Mount of Temptations and then up to the Monastery of Temptation. We drive into Jerusalem where we enjoy the spectacular scenery at Mt. Scopus to capture views of the Old City of Jerusalem. Then, we check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 7: Sunday, 02/12, JERUSALEM / BETHANY / QUMRAN / MASADA / JERUSALEM

QUMRAN / MASADA / JERUSALEM Mary and Martha's home was in Bethany and the Tomb of Lazarus is there as well. We explore Bethany this morning. Then, we proceed to the excavations of Qumran, the Essene community connected with John the Baptist which is the site of the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. As our journey continues, we travel to Masada and ascend by cable car to the mag-nificent ruins of the fortress where from 70 to 73 AD, Jewish defenders made their last stand in the Judean re-volt against Rome. Next we stop to the Dead Sea 1300 volt against Rome. Next, we stop to the **Dead Sea**, **1300 ft. below sea level (the lowest spot on earth)**, where we have the opportunity to "float" or lather up in the mud that is known for its mineral-rich properties. We return to our hotel to freshen up for dinner. Overnight in Jerusalem. **[B,D]**

Day 8: Monday, 02/13, JERUSALEM / BETHLEHEM / EIN KAREM / ABU GOSH / JERUSALEM

We drive to **Bethlehem** today to visit the Church of the Nativity, the Manger, the Crusader's Cloister and the Grotto of St. Jerome. Then, we visit the cave in Shepherd's Field where the angels announced Jesus' birth and **view the Fields of Boaz** from the story of Ruth. We will have free time to shop in Bethlehem. We continue to Ein Karem, birthplace of John the Baptist, and the Church of the Visitation, where Mary uttered the words of the Magnificat. Our final stop today is at Abu Gosh where we visit the Monastery from the Crusader's era that commemorates the journey of the ark of God. We return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]




Day 9: Tuesday, 02/14, JERUSALEM

Our first stop today offers a panoramic view of Jeru-salem from the Mount of Olives. We continue with a walk down the hill to Dominus Flevit Chapel where Jesus wept over Jerusalem. We make our way farther down the hill to visit the Garden of Gethsemane. Be-side the garden is the Church of All Nations, built over the location where Jesus endured his Agony before praying at the **Grotto of the Apostles** (known to us as the grotto of betrayal and the arrest of Jesus). We enter the Old City through the Zion Gate and see the Cardo and the remains of Nehemiah's Wall on the way to the Western (Wailing) Wall. We visit the Davidson Center and visit

the Church of St. Anne and the Pool of Bethesda. We return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 10: Wednesday, 02/15, JERUSALEM

Day 10: Wednesday, 02/15, JERUSALEM Early this morning, we prayerfully follow the Via Do-lorosa (Stations of the Cross) through the old city ending at Calvary. We proceed to the Lithostrotos and a rooftop visit to the Convent of the Sisters of Zion. We visit Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of Flag-ellation, and the Arch of Ecce Homo ("Behold the Man"). Our day continues as we proceed to the New City of Jerusalem to Mount Zion, the Upper Room, the tomb of King David and Dormition Abbey. Next, subject to availability and confirmation, we pay a visit to the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem where Knights and Dames of the Equestrian Order receive their pil-grims shell. Knights and Dames of the Order of the Holy Sepulchre are asked to vest for this meeting. Holy Sepulchre are asked to vest for this meeting. We have an audience with the Apostolic Administrator of the Latin Patriarchate, Archbishop Pierbattista Pizzabala. We return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]



Day 11: Thursday, 02/16, JERUSALEM We begin today with an early morning, return-visit to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, where we pray on top the Rock of Calvary and inside the Lord's tomb. We return to our hotel for breakfast. Our motor coach will take us first to the **Israel Museum** for a brief view of the **Model of the City of Jerusalem** at Jesus' time and a brief visit the **Shrine of the Book**, where we see the Dead Sea Scrolls on display. From there, we visit the beautiful **Church of St. Peter of Gallicantu** (The Cock Crows), location where Jesus was held in the house of the High Priest Caiaphas. We return to our hotel to prestates. Our day and our pilgrimage comes to a close as we enjoy a **group farewell dinner**. Overnight in Jeru-salem. **[B,D]**

Day 12: Friday, February 17, 2023, JERUSALEM / TEL AVIV / CHICAGO

This morning we travel to Tel Aviv's Ben Gurion Airport for our return flight back to the United States.
