TERMS AND CONDITIONS / TOUR CONTRACT

TOUR PRICE: Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 2/28/2020 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 36 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge.

ACCOMMODATIONS: In first class hotels or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$99 per night and based on availability. Re-quests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supple-ment will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

MEALS: Eleven full hot breakfasts and eleven dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included. Airport fees, departure taxes, and fuel surcharges are estimated on the original invoice and adjusted at the time of ticketing.

SIGHTSEEING: By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to availability.

NOT INCLUDED: •: Airport fees, departure taxes and fuel surcharges (est. - \$559); **•**: tips to guides, drivers and meal servers (\$172); and **•**: optional travel protection. An amount to cover these items will be added to your original invoice. Also not included: airline baggage fees, luggage handlers, passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned and items of a personal nature.

Payment of remaining balance received after 10/30/2022 will incur a \$50 penalty and/or a delay in your final travel documents. If air/tour cancellation is effected by pas-senger after 10/30/2022, or after air tickets are written, which-ever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.

Day 1: Monday, January 30, 2023, USA / ISTAN-BUL

Tour members are welcomed at an international airport for our departing flight to Tel Aviv via Istanbul, arriving the next morning. Meals served on board.

Day 2: Tuesday, 1/31, ISTANBUL / TEL AVIV / CAESAREA / MT CARMEL / TIBERIAS

Upon our arrival in Tel Aviv, we proceed north along the Mediterranean, to Caesarea Maritime, where St. Paul was imprisoned, tried, and sent from this Mediterranean harbor to Rome. We visit one of Herod the Great's palaces and see the ruins of the ancient amphitheater next to the ocean. From there, we proceed to Haifa and stop at the Stella Maris, Our Lady of Mount Carmel and the home of the prophet, Elijah. As we drive to the top of Tiberias we have a splendid view of the city and the Sea of Galilee. We proceed to our hotel in Tiberias to check in for dinner and overnight. [D]

Day 3: Wednesday, 2/1, TIBERIAS / MAGDALA / MT OF BEATITUDES / SEA OF GALILEE / TIBERIAS Today we visit Magdala, birthplace and home of Mary

Nagdalene, a witness to the resurrection. We spend time at **Duc in Altum Church**, a new and quite unique spiritual center. To commemorate Jesus preaching from the boat, Duc in Altum Church has coupled the boat-shaped altar in the church with the beautiful Sea of Galilee backdrop to bring history back to life. Other features of the church who followed Jesus, a mosaics chapel, and the Encounter Chapel with its floor from the original first-century market place of the Magdala port original first-century market place of the Magdala port. Once a frontrunner in first century culture, in Magdala's archeological park you can see mikvaot (ritual baths) that are more sophisticated than others from its period. The oldest synagogue in Galilee was also excavated in Magdala. As it exists in such a well preserved state from the time of Christ's teaching, much information could be extracted and shared. An ancient coin found in the syn-agogue during excavation has been determined to be from the time of Christ's ministry. Also unearthed was a marketplace on what was once the trade route that



has been able to tell MT OF BEATITUDES archeologists a great deal about life in Magdala and its role in ancient history. The Mount of Beatitudes, site of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount is our next stop. We relax and enjoy tranquil and contemplative time before our **boat ride** on the Sea of Galilee.

We return to Tiberias for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 4: Thursday, 2/2, TIBERIAS / MT TABOR / CANA / NAZARETH / TIBERIAS

We board our motor coach today and proceed to Mt. Tabor, site of the Transfiguration. The church has two altars: one dedicated to the symbolism of Our Lord on earth and the other is dedicated to Jesus in Heaven. From there, we visit Cana where Jesus performed His first miracle. As a lasting remembrance of Cana, couples may renew their wedding vows at the place where Jesus

changed the water into wine. Then, we proceed to Nazareth, where Jesus played, grew up amongst the other children of the city, and later worked with Joseph in car-pentry. It is here in the **Church of the Annunciation** just behind the altar where you can see the grotto where Mary said "yes" to the angel of the Lord. We visit **St. Jo-seph's carpentry shop, the Church of St. Joseph, and** Mary's well. Finally, we return to our hotel for dinner and overnight in Tiberias. [B,D]

Day 5: Friday, 2/3, TIBERIAS / CAESAREA PHILIPPI / CAPERNAUM / TABGHA / ST PETER'S PRIMACY / TIBERIAS

We venture north to visit **Caesarea Philippi**, just north of the Sea of Galilee and at the base of Mt. Herman. It is here you will see one of the main springs of the Joran River. Caesarea Philippi, also called "Banias", is the location of the testimony of St. Peter and where Jesus answered him, "You are the Rock and upon this rock I will build my Church." During our visit, we will see one of the three springs that feeds the Jordan River. On our way back toward Tiberias, we stop in **Capernaum**. This is the town where Peter lived and within which Je-sus made bic base of onerations for His Galilean ministry. As we visit the **ruins of the town** you will find out why Jesus focused his ministry here, where ancient Judaism flourished. We will visit the **THE SYNAGOGUE**

Synagogue where Jesus healed and taught, and also Peter's house. Nearby, we stop at Tabgha, location of the miracle of the loaves and fish and the Church of St. Peter's Primacy, where Jesus appeared after the Resurrection. We return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]



Day 6: Saturday, February 4, 2023, TIBERIAS / BET SHEAN / OSAR EL YAHUD / JERICHO / JERUSÁLEM

This morning we begin at Bet Shean (or the Scythopolis), which is a strategic junction between the Jezreel and Jordan River Valleys. It was here, in Bet Shean, where Jewish King Saul faced-off with the Philistines in a bat-



the at nearby Mount Gilboa (1004 BC). The victorious Philistines hung the bodies of King Saul and his sons on the walls of Bet Shean. Later, brilliant military strategy enabled King David to free Bet Shean of the Philistines and send them back to their strongholds in and around the Gaza region. We see ruins of Bet Shean's ancient theatre, Circus Maximus (chariot racing stadium) and Cardo Maximo (main street). From there, we head further south to Qsar El Yahud, the actual site where Jesus was baptized in the River Jordan. We renew our baptismal promises. Next, we visit Jericho, the world's oldest city. From the excavated tel atop the ruins of ancient Jer-icho, we view the lush green Jordan Valley, Elisha's spring and Qarantal, the Mount of Temptation. We continue on to Jerusalem to check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 7: Sunday, 2/5, JERUSALEM

Our motor coach will take us for a brief view of the Model of the City of Jerusalem at Jesus' time and

(briefly) visit the Shrine of the Book, where we see

the Dead Sea Scrolls on display. Then, we proceed to **Ein Karem**, birthplace of John the Baptist, and the **Church of the Visitation**, where Mary uttered the words of the Magnificat. After spending time there, BIRTH SPOT OF JESUS



we proceed to Bethlehem to visit the Church of the Nativity, the Manger, the Cru-sader's Cloister and the Grotto of St. Jerome. We then visit the cave in Shepherd's Field and view the Fields of Boaz. We take time to shop in Bethlehem before we return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 8: Monday, 2/6, JERUSALEM / QUMRAN / MA-SADA / JERUSALEM

Today, we proceed to the excavations of Qumran, the Essene community connected with John the Baptist and the site of the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. Then, we drive to Masada and ascend by cable car to the magnificent ruins of the fortress where, from 70 to 73 AD, Jewish defenders made their last stand in the Judean revolt against Rome. We see the remains of store-houses, cisterns and a sixth-century Byzantine church. On our return to Jerusalem, we stop at the shore of the **Dead Sea**, 1300 feet below sea level (the lowest spot on earth). We have the opportunity to swim in the Dead Sea be-fore we return to the hotel for dinner. After dinner, we proceed to the **Garden of Gethsemane for a holy hour**. Overnight in Jerusalem. [B,D]

Day 9: Tuesday, 2/7, JERUSALEM

Early this morning, we prayerfully follow the Via Dolo-

rosa (Stations of the Cross) through the old city to the Church of the Hóly Sepulchre, where we pray on top the **Rock** of Calvary and inside the Lord's tomb. After Mass, we return to our hotel for breakfast. Our next stop will be a visit Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of Flagella-tion, Lithostrotos, and the Arch of Ecce Homo ("Behold the Man") and the Convent of the



Sisters of Zion. We pro-ceed from there to the New City of Jerusalem to Mount Zion, the Upper Room, the tomb of King David and Dormition Abbey. We cross the Kidron Val-ley, pass the tombs of Absalom, Zechariah and St. James, on our way to the **Pool of Siloam**. The Pool of Siloam is the processing the under the billing ment to wards the reservoir to which Jesus sent the blind man to wash his eyes; his vision was miraculously restored. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem. [B,D]

Day 10: Wednesday, 2/8, JERUSALEM

Our morning begins with a panoramic view of Jerusa-lem from the Mount of Olives. We visit the Church of Pater Noster and the Chapel of Ascension. We contin-ue with a walk down the hill to Dominus Flevit Chapel where Jesus wept over Jerusalem. Then, we visit the Garden of Gethsemane. Beside the garden is the Church of

All Nations, built over the location where Jesus endured his Agony, and the **Grotto of the Apostles** (known to us as the grotto of betrayal and the arrest of Jesus). Next, we visit the grotto of betrayal and the arrest of Jesus). Next, we visit the **tomb of the Virgin Mary** and ask that she wrap her protective mantle around us and thank her for her most pre-cious gift...our Lord, Jesus Christ. Next, we visit the beautiful **Church of St. Peter of Gallicantu (The Cock Crows)**, lo-cation where Jesus was held in the house of the High Priest Caiaphas. We **enter the Old City through the Zion Gate** and see the Cardo and the remains of Nehemiah's Wall on the way to the **Western (Wailing) Wall**. We view, in **passing, the Dome of the Rock on the Temple Mount** and then visit the **Southern Steps**. We visit the **Davidson Center** and visit the **Church of St. Anne and the Pool of Bethesda**. Our day concludes as we return to our hotel for Bethesda. Our day concludes as we return to our hotel for a farewell dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 11: Thursday, 2/9, JERUSALEM / flight / ISTANBUL Today we depart Jerusalem and fly into Istanbul, Turkey. Istanbul was the capital of the Byzantine Empire under the names of Constantinople and Byzantium. First, we will stroll through **Hippodrome Square**, the former sporting and social center of Constantinople that hosted chariot races during the Roman period. Afterwards, we are off to witness the incredible majesty and splendor of the **Sultan Ahmet** Mosque. Popularly known as the Blue Mosque, this 17th century Ottoman sanctuary is adorned with six minarets and more than 20,000 hand-painted Iznik tiles. And then we will walk directly across from the mosque to visit the domed masterpiece of the **Hagia Sophia** before we head to the **Grand Bazaar**, the massive covered market that houses a labyrinth of streets lined with shops selling jewelry, leather products and many other handcrafted souvenirs. Today's journey concludes as we check into our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]



Day 12: Friday, 2/10, ISTANBUL After breakfast, we will drive to Iznik, formerly known as Nicaea, the important Roman and Byzantine town where the first Council of Nicaea was held during the reign of Constantine in 325 AD. Drive back to Istanbul. Next, we have free time to explore independently. This evening we enjoy a farewell dinner cruise on the Bosphorus and overnight. [B,D]

Day 13: Saturday, February 11, 2023, ISTANBUL / USA

Very early this morning, we proceed to the **Istanbul Airport** for our departing flight back to the United States. We arrive home today, knowing we have walked in the footsteps of Jesus and the early Christians.
