

TERMS AND CONDITIONS / TOUR CONTRACT

TOUR PRICE: Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 1/12/2023 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 36 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge.

ACCOMMODATIONS: In first class hotels or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$99 per night and based on availability. Requests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supplement will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

MEALS: Ten full hot breakfasts and ten dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included. Airport fees, departure taxes, and fuel surcharges are estimated on the original invoice and adjusted at the time of ticketing.

SIGHTSEEING: By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to availability.

NOT INCLUDED: ①: Airport fees, departure taxes and fuel surcharges (est. - \$499); ②: tips to guides, drivers and meal servers (est. - \$168); and ③: optional travel protection. An amount to cover these items will be added to your original invoice. Also not included: airline baggage fees, luggage handlers, passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned and items of a personal nature.

NOTE: Due to limited storage space on motor coaches, Pentecost Tours entitles each passenger to one checked bag and one carry-on bag that meets airline "size/weight" allowances. Baggage fees, overweight baggage charges, and fees for additional bags fall under the responsibility of the passenger. Be aware, while you may agree to pay fees for additional luggage, there may not be room on the motor coach.

ASSISTANCE: Pilgrims who require personal assistance must be accompanied by a paying passenger who will provide that assistance.

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION: A deposit of \$500 per person is required to secure reservations, which sum will be applied to the price of the tour, with the balance to be paid in full no later than 6/4/2023. Payment of remaining balance received after 6/4/2023 will incur a \$50 penalty and/or a delay in your final travel documents. Reservations made within 92 days of departure may be subject to a late charge.

- ▶ [PENALTY PHASE ONE] In the event of cancellation, refund will be made up to 5/7/2023 with a \$100 administrative fee plus any airline cancellation penalties.
- ▶[PENALTY PHASE TWO] From 5/7/2023 to 6/4/2023 the cancellation penalty is \$500 plus any airline cancellation penalties.
- ▶ [PENALTY PHASE THREE] If cancellation is received after 6/4/2023 refund will be subject to a minimum 40% cancellation fee plus any airline cancellation penalties, or an amount equal to expenses to the tour operator, whichever is greater.
- ▶There will be no refund for cancellations within 65 days of departure.

Credit card processing fees are non-refundable. Cancellation must be in writing and the effective date will be the date that Pentecost Tours, Inc. receives it. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 120 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. If the entire tour is cancelled by Pentecost Tours, Inc., you are entitled to a full refund.

NOTE: Any change request/alterations to the group flight itinerary, requests for airline deviations and/or added domestic flights, automatically advances into the next penalty level or the current level, whichever is greater. Once the change request/alteration is made, those arrangements are final and can NOT be changed back to the group arrangement.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round trip Chicago/Tel Aviv and Amman/Chicago on economy class jet via Turkish or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare, subject to participation of ten persons on entire flight itinerary. If air/tour cancellation is effected by passenger after 6/4/2023, or after air tickets are written, whichever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.

TRAVEL PROTECTION: Travel Protection is NOT included in the tour price. We highly suggest that all participants purchase a plan to help protect your trip and your investment. Plans offer benefits for trip cancellation/interruption, accident & sickness medical expense, emergency evacuation & repatriation, and more. You will be mailed a travel protection brochure along with a waiver form, in the event that you choose to decline coverage. The Plan Document will be provided, upon purchase. Read through this document carefully as it contains full plan and benefit details and exclusions & limitations. Please note that Medicare does not provide coverage outside of the United States. Check with your own insurance provider to determine whether or not you are covered outside of the U.S.

RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY: Land arrangements including surface transportation: Pentecost Tours, Inc., and the participating Tour Operators operate the land tours offered under this program only as agents of the railroads, car rental contractors, steamship lines, hotels, bus operators, sightseeing contractors and others that provide the actual land arrangements and are not liable for any act, omission, delay, injury, loss, damage or nonperformance occurring in connection with these land arrangements. Turkish and other IATA carriers, steamship lines and other transportation companies whose services are featured in these tours are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time passengers are not on board their conveyance. The passage contract in use by these companies when issued shall constitute the sole contract between the companies and the purchaser of these tours and/ or passage.

Day 1: Monday, September 4, 2023, CHICAGO /

Tour members are welcomed at an international airport for our departing flight to Istanbul via widebody aircraft, arriving the next morning. Meals served on board.

Day 2: Tuesday, 9/5, ISTANBUL / TEL AVIV / CAÉSAREA MAŘÍTIMÉ / MT CARMÉL / TIBERIAS

We take a connecting flight into Tel Aviv. Upon arrival, we board our motorcoach for our first sights of Israel. We travel north to **Caesarea Maritima** to see the Roman aqueduct and port, Crusader's Moat and the ruins of the ancient amphitheater next to the ocean. It was in Caesarea that Paul was imprisoned, tried, and sent from this Mediterranean harbor to Rome. Then, we proceed to Haifa and stop at the **Stella Maris**, **Our** Lady of Mount Carmel and the home of the prophet, Elijah. As we drive to the top of Tiberias we have a splendid view of the city and the Sea of Galilee. Our day concludes as we check in at our hotel in Tiberias for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 3: Wednesday, 9/6, TIBERIAS / MT TABOR / CANA / NAZARÉTH / MT OF BEATITUDES / **TIBERIAS**

After breakfast. we travel **to** Mt. Tabor, the mountain that early fathers of the church believed was the site of the Transfiguration of Jesus when Jesus spoke to Moses




and Elijah. The church has two altars: one dedicated to the symbolism of Our Lord on earth and the other is dedicated to Jesus in Heaven. Next, we proceed to Cana, the place where Jesus performed his first miracle. Couples may renew their wedding vows at the place where Jesus changed the water into wine at the wedding in Cana. We continue a short distance to Nazareth, where Jesus played, grew up amongst the other children of the city, and later worked with Joseph in carpentry. It is here in the **Church of the Annunciation** just behind the altar where you can see the grotto where Mary said "yes" to the angel of the Lord. Next, we visit St. Joseph's carpentry shop, Mary's Well, and the Church of St. Joseph. The Mount of Beatitudes, site of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount is the perfect end to our day. We relax in tranquil and contemplative time before we return to our hotel for dinner. Overnight in Tiberias. [B,D]

Day 4: Thursday, 9/7, TIBERIAS / CAESAREA PHILIPPI / CAPERNAUM / ST PETER'S PRIMACY / **SEA OF GALILEE / TIBERIAS**

This morning, we venture north to visit Caesarea Philippi, just north of the Sea of Galilee and at the

base of Mt. Herman. Also called "Banias", Caesarea Philippi is the location where Jesus declared Peter "Rock" and entrusted him with the keys to the kingdom of Heaven. During our visit, we will see one of the three springs that feeds the Jordan River. On our way back toward Tiberias, we stop in **Capernaum**. This is the town where Peter lived and within which Jesus made his base of operations for His Galilean ministry. As we visit the ruins of the town you will find out why Jesus focused his ministry here, where ancient Judaism flourished. We will visit the Synagogue where Jesus healed and taught, and also Peter's house. Nearby, we stop at Tabgha, location of the miracle of the loaves and fish and the Church of St.

Peter's Primacy, where Jesus appeared after the Resurrection. We visit there before spending time on the Sea of Galilee on a relaxing boat ride. We return to our hotel for dinner and an overnight. **[B,D]**



Day 5: Friday, 9/8, TIBERIAS / BET SHEAN / QSAR EL YAHUD / JERICHO / JERÚSALEM

Travelling south parallel to the Jordan River, we stop at Bet Shean (or the Scythopolis), which is a strategic junction between the Jezreel and Jordan River Valleys. It was here where Jewish King Saul facedoff with the Philistines in a battle at nearby Mount Gilboa (1004 BC). The victorious Philistines hung the bodies of King Saul and his sons on the walls of Bet Shean. Later, brilliant military strategy enabled King David to free Bet Shean of the Philistines and send them back to their strongholds in and around the Gaza region. We see ruins of Bet Shean's ancient theatre, Circus Maximus (chariot racing stadium) and Cardo Maximo (main street). Qasar El Yahud, the actual site where Jesus was baptized in the River Jordan is nearby and we stop there to renew our baptismal **promises.** Then we proceed to Jericho, the world's oldest city. Our day concludes as we check in at our hotel in Jérusalem for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 6: Saturday, 9/9, JERUSALEM / QUMRAN / MÁSADA / DEÁD SEÁ / JERUSALEM

The excavations of Qumran, the Essene community connected with John the Baptist and the site of the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found, will be where we begin today. Then, we ascend by **cable** car to the magnificent ruins of the fortress in Masada where, from 70 to 73 AD, Jewish defenders made their last stand in the Judean revolt against Rome. On our return to Jerusalem, we stop at the shore of the **Dead Sea**, 1300 ft. below sea level (the lowest spot on earth), where we have the opportunity to "float" or lather up in the mud that is known for its mineral-rich **properties.** Our day concludes as we return to the hotel to freshen up for dinner. Overnight in Jerusalem. [B,D]

Day 7: Sunday, 9/10, JERUSALEM / BETHLEHEM / **JERUSALEM**

After breakfast, we visit the New City of Jerusalem, Mount Zion, the Upper Room, and the tomb of King David. From there, we drive to Bethlehem to visit the Church of the Nativity, the Manger, the Crusader's Cloister and the Grotto

of St. Jerome. We then BETHLEHEM visit the cave in Shepherd's Field and view the **Fields of Boaz**. En route to Jerusalem we see the Tomb of Rachel. Pilgrims will have an opportunity to spend some time shopping in Bethlehem before returning to our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]




Day 8: Monday, 9/11, JERUSALEM

Early this morning, we prayerfully follow the Via Do-lorosa (Stations of the Cross) through the old city to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, where we pray on top the Rock of Calvary and inside the Lord's tomb. From there we visit Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of Flagellation, Lithostrotos, and the Arch of Ecce Homo ("Behold the Man") and the Convent of the **Sisters of Zion.** This afternoon, we proceed **to Ein Karem**, birthplace of John the Baptist, and the **Church** of the Visitation, where Mary uttered the words of the Magnificat. Dinner and overnight at the hotel in Jerusalem. [B,D]

Day 9: Tuesday, 9/12, JERUSALEM

Our morning begins with a panoramic view of Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives. We visit the Church of Pater Noster and the Chapel of Ascension. We continue with a walk down the hill to **Dominus Flevit Chapel** where Jesus wept over Jerusalem. Then, we visit the Garden of Gethsemane. Be-



side the garden is the **Church of All Nations**, built over the Tocation where Jesus endured his Agony, and the **Grotto of the Apostles** (known to us as the grotto of betrayal and the arrest of Jesus). Next, we visit the **tomb of the Virgin Mary** and ask that she wrap her protective mantle around us and thank her for her most precious aift—our Lord, Jesus Christ. Next, we visit the beautiful Church of St. Peter of Gallicantu (The Cock Crows), location where Jesus was held in the house of the High Priest Caiaphas. We enter the Old City through the Zion Gate and see the Cardo and the remains of Nehemiah's Wall on the way to the Western (Wailing) Wall.

We view, in passing, the Dome of the Rock on the Temple Mount and then visit the Southern Steps. We visit the Davidson Center and visit the Church of St. Anne and the Pool of Bethesda. Our farewell dinner will be celebrated tonight in Israel. Overnight in Jerusalem. [B,D]

Day 10: Wednesday, 9/13, JERUSALEM / ALLENBY HUSSEIN BRIDGE / PETRA

Today we depart Jerusálem cross the Allenby Bridge into Jordan. We proceed to Petra, the Nabatean city and new wonder of the world. Rediscovered 1812, Petra earned its nickname because the city is largely carved in colored sandstone. From the El Ji Post, pass through the Sig (natural gorge) to visit the treasury, theater, Royal Tombs of the Urn/Silk. Corinthian





and the Palace, and other amazing sites as we travel on foot back through the siq. Those who wish to skip this part of the journey are free to sit back and enjoy the scenery until the others return. Today's journey concludes as we check in at our hotel in Petra for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 11: Thursday, 9/14, PETRA / MADABA / MT NEBO / AMMAN

After breakfast, we travel to the Roman Byzantine town of Madaba (biblical Medeba), the city of fruit and water. We visit the Greek Orthodox St. George Church to view the mosaic map of Jordan, Jerusalem and Egypt. We spend some time at Mount Nebo, the location where Moses saw the Promised Land. Moses spent his final days and was laid to rest here. Then, we visit the sanctuary at Nebo. This is one of the most revered holy sites of Jordan. We check in at a hotel by the airport for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 12: Friday, September 15, 2023, AMMAN / ISTANBUL / CHICAGO

This morning, we proceed to the **Amman Queen Alia International Airport** for our departing flight back to the United States. Our journey in the footsteps of Jesus offers the mind and soul a treasure trove of memories inspired by God's majestic landscape and a world we explore one pilgrimage at a time. **[B]**
