TERMS AND CONDITIONS / TOUR CONTRACT

TOUR PRICE: Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 12/6/2023 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 26 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge.

ACCOMMODATIONS: In first class hotels or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$109 per night and based on availability. Requests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supplement will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

MEALS: Ten full hot breakfasts and seven dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included. Airport fees, departure taxes, and fuel surcharges are estimated on the original invoice and adjusted at the time of ticketing.

SIGHTSEEING: By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to availability.

NOT INCLUDED: •: Airport fees, departure taxes and fuel surcharges (est. - \$599); •: tips to guides, drivers and meal servers (est. - \$160.50); and •: optional travel protection. A travel protection flyer will be provided with more information. Also not included: airline baggage fees, luggage handlers, passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned and items of a personal nature.

<u>NOTE:</u> Due to limited storage space on motor coaches, Pentecost Tours entitles each passenger to one checked bag and one carry-on bag that meets airline "size/weight" allowances. Baggage fees, overweight baggage charges, and fees for additional bags fall under the responsibility of the passenger. Be aware, while you may agree to pay fees for additional luggage, there may not be room on the motor coach.

ASSISTANCE: Pilgrims who require personal assistance must be accompanied by a paying passenger who will provide that assistance.

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION: A deposit of \$500 per person is required to secure reservations, which sum will be applied to the price of the tour, with the balance to be paid in full no later than 7/6/2024. Payment of remaining balance received after 7/6/2024 will incur a \$50 penalty and/or a delay in your final travel documents. Reservations made within 92 days of departure may be subject to a late charge.

► [PENALTY PHASE ONE] In the event of cancellation, refund will be made up to 6/8/2024 with a \$100 administrative fee plus any airline cancellation penalties. ▶ PENALTY PHASE TWO] From 6/8/2024 to 7/6/2024 the cancellation penalty is \$500 plus any airline cancellation

 PENALTY PHASE THREE] If cancellation is received after 7/6/2024 refund will be subject to a minimum 40% can-

cellation fee plus any airline cancellation penalties, or an amount equal to expenses to the tour operator, whichever is greater.

• There will be no refund for cancellations within 65 days of departure.

Credit card processing fees are non-refundable and always the responsibility of the passenger. Cancellation must be in writing and the effective date will be the date that Pentecost Tours, Inc. receives it. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 120 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. If the entire tour is cancelled by Pentecost Tours, Inc., you are entitled to a full refund.

<u>NOTE:</u> Any change request/alterations to the group flight itinerary, requests for airline deviations and/or added domestic flights, automatically advances into the next penalty level or the current level, whichever is greater. Once the change request/alteration is made, those arrangements are final and can NOT be changed back to the group arrangement.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round trip Honolulu/Venice and Rome/Honolulu on economy class jet via Swiss Air lines or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare, subject to participation of ten persons on entire flight itinerary. If air/tour cancellation is effected by passenger after 7/6/2024, or after air tickets are written, whichever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.

TRAVEL PROTECTION: Travel Protection is NOT included in the tour price. We suggest that all participants purchase a plan to help protect you and your trip investment. Plans can provide benefits such as Trip Cancellation, Trip Interruption, Emergency Medical and Emergency Evacuation/Repatriation, Trip Delay, Baggage Delay and more. You will be mailed a travel protection flyer along with an enrollment and waiver form. Full terms and details of a travel insurance plan, including limitations and exclusions can be found in the travel insurance plan policy or description for coverage. Please note that Medicare does not provide coverage outside of the United States. Check with your own insurance provider to determine whether or not you are covered outside of the U.S.

RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY: Land arrangements including surface transportation: Pentecost Tours, Inc., and the participating Tour Operators operate the land tours offered under this program only as agents of the railroads, car rental contractors, steamship lines, hotels, bus operators, sightseeing contractors and others that provide the actual land arrangements and are not liable for any act, omission, delay, injury, loss, damage or nonperformance occurring in connection with these land arrangements. Swiss Air lines and other IATA carriers, steamship lines and other transportation companies whose services are featured in these tours are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time passengers are not on board their conveyance. The passage contract in use by these companies when issued shall constitute the sole contract between the companies and the purchaser of these tours and/or passage.

TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS: In response to world health initiatives, many countries and airlines are implementing travel requirements that can include, but are not limited to: masks, testing, vaccines, specific documentations, etc. These requirements are the responsibility of each passenger. Passengers must have a valid, working email.

MISCELLANEOUS FEES: All changes must be in writing and may incur a per-person charge for each revision. Deposits received within 92 days of departure may incur a late registration fee.

LAND ARRANGEMENTS: The tour operator reserves the right to change the itinerary because of emergencies or extenuating circumstances beyond our control.

ERRORS: The Pentecost Tours staff does its best to provide you with accurate billing, brochures, etc. However, in the event of computer error, verbal or written human errors, we reserve the right to invoice, re-invoice, or forward corrected materials.

Day 1: Sunday, October 6, 2024, HONOLULU / VENICE

Today we depart Honolulu for our overnight flight to Venice. Meals are served on board.

Day 2: Monday 10/7, VENICE

Upon our arrival in Venice, we proceed to Venice Mestre to check in at our hotel for a welcome dinner and overnight. **[D]**

Day 3: Tuesday 10/8, VENICE

Today we explore Venice, beginning with an orientation tour of the charming city. Venice is built on 118 tiny islands, criss-crossed by 160 canals, and linked by 400 footbridges. We visit the **Church of San Marco** where we have time to pray and browse **St. Mark's Square.** We experience a **gondola ride** and weave through the canals. Then, we take a **water taxi to and between the** three islands in the Venetian lagoon.

•<u>Murano</u>, known for its beautiful glassworks, is the first island. Demonstrations by master craftsmen can' be observed and their creations can be purchased in island shop's.

Burano, famous for its artisan lace, exhibits and sells treasures of the trade in the Lace Museum and in boutiques. Burano's 15th-century leaning bell tower, part of San Martino Church, attracts tourists as does Via Galuppi, the island's main street. The colorful hues on homes and the canal are a popular focus for local and visiting artists. The third island, <u>Tor-</u> cello, draws tourists to see the incredible mosaics within the 7th-century Cathedral of Santa Maria



Dell'Assunta. This ancient island is unique as it is primarily a nature reserve, accessible only by walk paths. This evening, we enjoy authentic northern Italian cuisine as dinner is on our own. Overnight in Venice Mestre. [B]

Day 4: Wednesday 10/9, VENICE / PISA / FLOR-ENCE

We depart Venice this morning and proceed to the Tuscan town of **Pisa**, a city made famous by its spectacular architectural wonder~the Leaning Tower. Construction began in 1173 on sandy silt subsoil. Before the 4th level had even been completed, the tower was already leaning but construction continued, on and off, until the tow-er's 8th story was complete in 1350. Over the centuries, the 284-step tower defied the odds (and laws of gravity) as it continued to askew from perpendicular. Changes in the degree to which it leaned were so subtle that it surprised many visitors when the structure was closed by engineers in 1990 to implement a plan to save the tower from toppling over. In fact, the lean was corrected by 45 centimeters. The **Leaning Tower**, still leans but has been corrected enough to welcome back visitors to tour the historic structure. We will visit the famous icon of Pisa before proceeding to the Cathedral. Then, we spend a little free time in the Piazza dei Miracoli area. You may want to see The Monumental Cemetery (ancient graveyard) and the Baptistery (largest in Italy). Then, we head **to beautiful Florence**. Our day concludes as we check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 5: Thursday 10/10, FLORENCE Today begins with a visit the Academia to see the orig-inal statue of "David". Then, nearby is the Basilica della Santissima Annunziata, Renaissance-style, minor basil-ica. We visit this beautiful and highly venerated Marian Shrine. panoramic view from the Piazza Michelange-**Io.** From there, we visit the **Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore** and view the Baptistery and Campanile (bell tower). The Cathedral is the fourth largest church in Europe and the tallest building in present day Florence. Especially notable are the Baptistery's gilded bronze doors, which were done by Ghiberti in 1401. From there, we visit the historical and present day center of Florentine activity, the **Palazzo Vecchio** ("old palace") and the **Piazza della Signoria**. The Piazza is a popular area for people to stroll and gather, in the past it has served as a place of public meeting and even execution. There are many statues found in the vicinity - some are originals and some are copies, like David (the original is housed in the Academy of Fine Arts). We will make our way to Santa Croce area where the remainder of the day is free to explore on our own. Suggestions include:

- Opera Del Duomo Museum, home of a Michelangelo Pieta and the Mary Magdalene of Donatello. Or, the Uffizi Gallery, one of the most renowned houses of art in all of Italy.
- Galilei Science Museum if science is your niche.
- The Santa Croce leather school you can view a demonstration by their talented master craftsmen.

 View frescoes by Fra Angelico at San Marco's Convent. There is so much to see and do in Florence. Therefore, take this evening to grab a guick bite to eat and continue exploring or choose a fine restaurant to enjoy a relaxed sit-down meal. Dinner is on your own this evening. [B]

Day 6: Friday 10/11, FLORENCE / SIENA / ASSISI

We depart Florence and proceed south to Siena to visit the Basilica of St Dominic, where we have an opportunity to view the relics of St Catherine, and the Duomo (cathedral) of Siena, a remarkable example of Italian Gothic architecture. We enjoy a guided tour of the city and stop at the **Piazza del Campo**. The fan shaped Piazza is home to the barebacked horse race, known as the Palio, and many other important events. We proceed to Assisi



to check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B.D]

Day 7: Saturday 10/12, ASSISI Welcome to beautiful Assisi! This morning, we stop in the lower plains to explore the Basilica of St Mary of the Angels, built in 1569 to protect the Portiuncula. The Portiuncula is the church that St Francis and his brothers

were given shortly after Pope Innocent III approved of their rule. We also see the statue of St Francis with the live white doves, the thorn-less rose bush and the cave where St Francis prayed in solitude. From there, we visit the Basilica of St. Clare, which houses her incorrupt body in a crystal casket in the crypt. Off the main nave of the Basilica is the crucifix from which Christ spoke to St. Francis in San Damiano. St Francis heard a voice say, "Go Francis, repair my church, which is in ruin." Thinking that God was telling him to rebuild San Damiano, Francis renounced worldly goods and began immediately to re-pair the building. Only later did the saint realize that God had been speaking of His living Church. Then, we will be escorted by mini coaches to the **church of St Damiano**. Dinner and overnight in Assisi. [B,D]

Day 8: Sunday 10/13, ASSISI / ORVIETO / ROME

As we depart Assisi this morning, we stop first to visit one of Christianity's most revered shrines, the Basilica of St. Francis, and see the frescoes depicting events in the life of this gentle saint. Then, our journey continues to Orvieto where we stop to explore the tiny city. In 1263 a pious German priest, Peter of Prague, stopped in Bolsena to cel-

ebrate Mass on his pilgrimage route to Rome. While a devout practicing-Catholic servant, Peter couldn't erase the skepticism he felt about Christ being present in the consecrated Host. As he uttered the words of Consecration at the altar above St. Christina's tomb, blood began seeping from the consecrated Host. Blood dribbled across his hands onto the altar and corporal leaving Fr. Peter quite stunned and confused. He interrupted Mass requesting to be taken immediately to the tiny neighboring city of Orvieto (just 10 miles away), where the Holy Father, Pope Urban IV, was residing. An investi-gation was launched and orders were given to retrieve and transport the Host and blood-stained linen to the Orvieto Cathedral where they were, and still are today, reverently enshrined and exhibited. It was this miracle



that prompted Pope Urban IV to commission St. Thomas Aquinas to write a special Mass for what was to become our annual Feast of Corpus Christi. We visit the Cathedral of Orvieto (location of the shrine) where the Eucharistic Miracle is exhibited. Then, we proceed farther

south to Rome to check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B.D]

Day 9: Monday 10/14, ROME

Our first stop today is at the Vatican Museum and the Sistine Chapel where Michelangelo's restored masterpieces adorn the ceilings and walls. We enjoy a guided tour and then proceed to the Basilica of St. Peter. Inside the basilica, we view one of Rome's most recognized works of art, Michelangelo's Pieta and we visit the tombs of our newest saints, Pope St. John Paul II and Pope St. John XXIII. From there, There will be free time to explore on your own.

Just outside the basilica is the Vatican Post Office. Feel free to stop and purchase postcards and stamps to send to family and friends (bring addresses). Send one to yourself as a keepsake! Remember, although Vatican City is located with the city limits of Rome it is, in fact, its own state. With 110 acres and fewer than 900 residents, Vatican City State boasts the title

- chased inside the post office. (Very crowded on day of Papal Audience)
- Adjacent to St. Peter's Square are shops/restaurants. The 312-step climb to the "cupola" Dome of St. Peter's Basilica is worth the effort/energy for the magnificent view. An elevator/lift to the roof level is available but from the roof to the top is step by

Stability of the stabil Nearby is the renowned **Colosseum where we make a brief photo stop (outside only).** Next, we proceed to the **Basilica of St Paul Outside the Walls**, an impressive church which houses the remains of St. Paul under the main altar. Our day concludes as we return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. **[B,D]**



Day 10: Tuesday 10/15, ROME Today we proceed to St. John Lateran, the Cathedral church of the Pope. This church was originally built by Constantine when he ended the Christian persecutions. Here we see the Altar that holds the relics of Sts. Peter and Paul. Next to the Basilica is the Baptistery and across the street is the **Sancta Scala** - Holy Stairs, which were transported from Pilate's palace in Jerusalem and on which the ported from Pilate's palace in Jerusalem and on which the Savior climbed before His crucifixion. Those who wish to pray each step on their knees may do so. The option to take the side stairs on foot is also available. Then, nearby we **visit St. Mary Major,** where inside the Basilica we view relics of Jesus' manger from Bethlehem. Next, we visit the **Chiesa del Gesù** (Rome's first Jesuit Church, where a 3D fresco adorns the ceiling and aisles are replaced by petite chapels that face the main altar. To the right of the altar, is the a reliquary containing part of the Jesuits). We visit the **catcombs**. This evening sample the cullinary delights of catacombs. This evening, sample the culinary delights of the Romans at the restaurant of your choice as dinner is on your own. Overnight in Rome. [B]

Day 11: Wednesday 10/16, ROME This morning, we attend the much anticipated Papal Audience with Our Holy Father, Pope Francis (provided he is home). We listen to the words of His Holiness and receive his blessing with pilgrims from all over the world. Then, we enjoy an **optional walking tour** to see some of the city's tourist favorites, such as: • Trevi Fountain. Have a friend take your photograph as you toss your coin in the famous fountain assur-

- as you toss your coin in the famous fountain, assuring your return to Rome (as legend has it anyway).
- Piazza Navona. Local artisans display/sell their craft.
 Our day concludes as we enjoy a farewell dinner with wine. Overnight in Rome. [B,D]

Day 12: Thursday, October 17, 2024, ROME / HONOLULU Today we bid farewell to Italy (Arrivederci Italia!) as we transfer to the **airport** for our return flight to Honolulu. Our pilgrimage offers the mind and soul a treasure trove of memories inspired by God's majestic landscape and a world we explore one pilgrimage at a time. [B]
