

TERMS AND CONDITIONS / TOUR CONTRACT

TOUR PRICE: Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 1/29/2024 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 36 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge.

ACCOMMODATIONS: In first class hotels or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$99 per night and based on availability. Requests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supplement will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

MEALS: Nine full hot breakfasts and seven dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included. Airport fees, departure taxes, and fuel surcharges are estimated on the original invoice and adjusted at the time of ticketing.

SIGHTSEEING: By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to availability.

NOT INCLUDED: ①: Airport fees, departure taxes and fuel surcharges (est. - 549); ②: tips to guides, drivers and meal servers (est. - \$162.50); and ③: optional travel protection. A travel protection flyer will be provided with more information. Also not included: airline baggage fees, luggage handlers, passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned and items of a personal nature.

NOTE: Due to limited storage space on motor coaches, Pentecost Tours entitles each passenger to one checked bag and one carry-on bag that meets airline "size/weight" allowances. Baggage fees, overweight baggage charges, and fees for additional bags fall under the responsibility of the passenger. Be aware, while you may agree to pay fees for additional luggage, there may not be room on the motor coach.

ASSISTANCE: Pilgrims who require personal assistance must be accompanied by a paying passenger who will provide that assistance.

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION: A deposit of \$500 per person is required to secure reservations, which sum will be applied to the price of the tour, with the balance to be paid in full no later than 6/29/2024. Payment of remaining balance received after 6/29/2024 will incur a \$50 penalty and/or a delay in your final travel documents. Reservations made within 100 days of departure may be subject to a late charge.

- ▶ [PENALTY PHASE ONE] In the event of cancellation, refund will be made up to 6/9/2024 with a \$100 administrative fee plus any airline cancellation penalties.
- ▶ [PENALTY PHASE TWO] From 6/9/2024 to 6/29/2024 the cancellation penalty is \$500 plus any airline cancellation penalties.
- ▶ [PENALTY PHASE THREE] If cancellation is received after 6/29/2024 refund will be subject to a minimum 40% cancelation fee plus any airline cancellation penalties, or an amount equal to expenses to the tour operator, whichever is greater.
- ▶There will be no refund for cancellations within 65 days of departure.

Credit card processing fees are non-refundable and always the responsibility of the passenger. Cancellation must be in writing and the effective date will be the date that Pentecost Tours, Inc. receives it. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 120 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. If the entire tour is cancelled by Pentecost Tours, Inc., you are entitled to a full refund.

NOTE: Any change request/alterations to the group flight itinerary, requests for airline deviations and/or added domestic flights, automatically advances into the next penalty level or the current level, whichever is greater. Once the change request/alteration is made, those arrangements are final and can NOT be changed back to the group arrangement.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round trip Detroit/Dublin and Dublin/Detroit on economy class jet via American or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare, subject to participation of ten persons on entire flight titinerary. If air/tour cancellation is effected by passenger after 6/29/2024, or after air tickets are written, whichever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.

TRAVEL PROTECTION: Travel Protection is NOT included in the tour price. We suggest that all participants purchase a plan to help protect you and your trip investment. Plans can provide benefits such as Trip Cancellation, Trip Interruption, Emergency Medical and Emergency Evacuation/Repatriation, Trip Delay, Baggage Delay and more. You will be mailed a travel protection flyer along with an enrollment and waiver form. Full terms and details of a travel insurance plan, including limitations and exclusions can be found in the travel insurance plan policy or description for coverage. Please note that Medicare does not provide coverage outside of the United States. Check with your own insurance provider to determine whether or not you are covered outside of the U.S.

RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY: Land arrangements including surface transportation: Pentecost Tours, Inc., and the participating Tour Operators operate the land tours offered under this program only as agents of the railroads, car rental contractors, steamship lines, hotels, bus operators, sightseeing contractors and others that provide the actual land arrangements and are not liable for any act, omission, delay, injury, loss, damage or nonperformance occurring in connection with these land arrangements. American and other IATA carriers, steamship lines and other transportation companies whose services are featured in these tours are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time passengers are not on board their conveyance. The passage contract in use by these companies when issued shall constitute the sole contract between the companies and the purchaser of these tours and/or passage.

TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS: In response to world health initiatives, many countries and airlines are implementing travel requirements that can include, but are not limited to: masks, testing, vaccines, specific documentations, etc. These requirements are the responsibility of each passenger. **Passengers must have a valid, working email.**

MISCELLANEOUS FEES: All changes must be in writing and may incur a per-person charge for each revision. Deposits received within 100 days of departure may incur a late registration fee.

LAND ARRANGEMENTS: The tour operator reserves the right to change the itinerary because of emergencies or extenuating circumstances beyond our control.

ERRORS: The Pentecost Tours staff does its best to provide you with accurate billing, brochures, etc. However, in the event of computer error, verbal or written human errors, we reserve the right to invoice, re-invoice, or forward corrected materials.

MASS WILL BE CELEBRATED DAILY

Day 1: Monday, October 7, 2024, USA / DUBLIN

Pilgrims are welcomed at an international airport for our departing flight to the Emerald Isle aboard a wide-bodied jet, arriving the next morning. Meals are served on board.

Day 2: Tuesday 10/8, DUBLIN / ST. BRIGID'S SHRINE / DOWNPATRICK / BELFAST



Upon our arrival in Dublin, CATHEDRAL we proceed north to Kilcurry Church which houses a small piece of skull said to belong to St. Brigid. Nearby is Saint Brigid's Shrine at Faughart. Records indicate St. Brigid's birth in 452 and tradition says it happened in the town of Faughart. She immersed her life in service to God by helping the poor, needy and oppressed. Miracles linked to Brigid are associated with fertility, animals, land, new life and rebirth. We visit the stone station believed to be linked to healing.

During our visit, which falls in the 1500th anniversary year of her passing, we stop at the **holy well** near the Old Faughart graveyard. From there, we proceed to Downpatrick. We visit the **Down Cathedral**, the historical **burial place of St.** Patrick and visit his grave. Our day concludes in Belfast where we spend some time at the **Titanic Museum**. The museum was master-planned over 185 acres of the heritage site where the Titanic was designed and built. Then, we check in at our hotel for a welcome dinner and overnight. [D]

Day 3: Wednesday 10/9, BELFAST / GIANTS CAUSE-WAY / LOUGH DERG / WESTPORT

Our morning begins with drive to Giant's Causeway, a unique LOUGH DERG geological landscape that is truly unlike any place else on earth. The causeway's interlocking hexagonal columns, resulting from the basaltic lava of an ancient volcanic eruption 6 million years ago, forever changed County Antrim's northern coast, earning it the prestige of a "Unesco World Heritage Site" title. Reading and hearing about the causeway does not begin to offer any realistic glimpse into this natural phenomenon. Only seeing is believing! Therefore, we shall "see". From there, we drive to an ancient site of pilgrimage on a small island called Lake of the Cave (now simply Lough Derg), where a 5th-century legend says Christ revealed to St. Patrick the entrance to Purgatory. We **explore Lough Derg**





(St. Patrick's Purgatory) and then travel to Westport to check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. **[B.D]**



Day 4: Thursday 10/10, WESTPORT / CROAGH PAT-RICK / KYLEMORE / CONNEMARA / WESTPORT

After breakfast we drive to Croagh Patrick, Ireland's Holy Mountain. Here St. Patrick spent the forty days of Lent in the year 441 AD in prayer and fasting. Our journey continues to the shores of Kylemore Lough to visit **Kylemore**, a gothic castle, now a Benedictine Abbey. We enjoy time exploring the Abbey, gardens, and the walk along the lake up to the **beautiful chapel**. We enjoy sites of the Connemara, characterized by peat bogs, rugged, mountainous terrain and lush countryside that is home to a great variety of wildlife. We return to Westport where the remainder of the day is free to explore independently. This evening, wander the streets of Westport and sample authentic Irish fare at the restaurant or pub of your choice as **dinner is on your own**. After dinner, choose from the endless options of pubs occupying every other storefront and enjoy a glass of Guinness or a mug of Irish ale. The city boasts one of the most wellknown and visited pubs around, Matt Malloy's. Many of the pubs, including Matt Malloy's, have traditional Irish music and/or dancing as well. Overnight in Westport. [B]

Day 5: Friday 10/11, WESTPORT / KNOCK / GALWAY



Today we travel to Knock, a humble village whose attracts shrine pilgrims from all over the world, including John Paul II (1979) and Mother Teresa (1993). On August 21, 1879, the eve of the Oc-

tave of the Assumption, the parish church of Knock was the scene of a heavenly apparition. The Blessed Mother, St. Joseph, St. John the Evangelist, and an altar with a Lamb upon it were seen by 15 townspeople. The saints were silent; no message was given to the people, only an example of prayer and a rich symbolism in their appearances. We visit the location of the apparition, the Basilica of Our Lady, and have the opportunity to explore the grounds. From there, we head to Galway. You will have free time to explore on your own or take an **optional walking tour** with the tour escort to explore Galway city. Galway is a vibrant cultural experience packed with street artists, magicians and musicians, restaurants, shops, and more. Our day concludes as we check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 6: Saturday 10/12, GALWAY / CLIFFS OF MOHER / ADARE / BUNRATTY / LIMERICK

This morning we depart Galway for the incredible and dramatic **Cliffs of Moher**, where nearly 5 miles of layered black shale and sandstone cliff rock defiantly soars almost 700 feet above the aggressive might of the Atlantic Ocean. The grandeur of this breathtaking natural phenomenon makes it a "must see" for locals and country quests. The best vantage point (weather permitting) is from O'Briens tower located on the highest cliff. Next, we travel to Adare, a beautifully manicured village of thatch-roof cottages. We visit **Holy** Trinity Church and then continue to Bunratty to explore the grounds and attend Bunratty Castle's festive Medieval **Banquet**, a traditional-Irish dinner experience with story-telling and song. Afterwards, we proceed to Limerick. Overnight in Limerick. [B,D]

Day 7: Sunday 10/13, LIMERICK / GALLARUS ORATORY / SLEA HEAD / DINGLE / LIMERICK

Our day begins with the journey southwest to the Dingle Peninsula which thrusts out into the Atlantic Ocean to claim Ireland's most westerly point. Here, majestic hills soar in hues of green and purple over vast bowls of unspoiled valleys. Mountain streams tumble down to lakes, hedge rows blaze with fuchias and golden beaches stretch for miles. The Dingle Peninsula is a place of intense, shifting beauty. We visit historic **Gallarus Oratory**, believed to be over 1000 years old and is the best preserved ancient church in Ireland. It's one of the few remaining shrines of this type to survive today and is the most distinctive edifice on the Dingle peninsula. It is typical of the type of church in which St. Patrick himself worshipped. Then, we wind around the picturesque coast to Slea Head and Dingle. We return to Limerick for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

Day 8: Monday 10/14, LIMERICK / ROCK OF CASHEL / HOLY CROSS ABBEY / KILKENNY / DUBLIN

The **Rock of Cashel** is an impressive medieval complex called "The Acropolis of Ancient Ireland" and is one of the most spectacular archeological sites in the country. Dating from the 4th century, it was originally used as a fortress. Mighty stone walls encircle a complete round tower, a roofless abbey, a 12th century Romanesque chapel, and numer-



ous other buildings and high crosses. Our next stop is at **Holy** Cross Abbev. Built in 1169, Benedictines and Cistercians have occupied the Abbey during different periods of its history.

Here we view a piece of the True Cross. **Kilkenny** is a charming inland city and we head there next. Overlooking the River Nore is a famous fortress, **Kilkenny Castle**, which was occupied up until 1935 when the exorbitant cost of upkeep eventually resulted in the 1967 donation of the castle to the country of Ireland. We visit the castle and also one of the country's medieval treasures, **St. Canice's Cathedral**, that dominates the city skyline. Time permitting, we spend some time at the Kilkenny Design Center which has boasting rights to some of the most magnificent retail goods, including china, crystal, knitwear, Irish jewelpy, pottery and so much more. Continuing through the midland counties, our journey today ends in Dublin. We check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. **[B,D]**

Day 9: Tuesday 10/15, DUBLIN / GLENDALOUGH / DUBLIN



A brief drive south of Dublin is a monastic settlement established in the 6th century by St. Kevin, who was born in 498 of royal blood but rejected his life of privilege to live as a hermit in a cave in **Glendalough** (pro-

nounced Glen-dole-lock). Amid the ruins, one can feel the powerful sense of peace and tranquility. We return to **Dublin**, a city known for its modern influences combined with the beauty and heritage of the past. Elegant shops, hotels, galleries, coffee houses and a stunning variety of restaurants have sprung up on almost every street in the capital. The group will enjoy a city tour, where we see the statue-lined O'Connell Street, Georgian Squares, and Phoenix Park. We stop to visit St. Patrick's Cathedral. One of Dublin's top tourist attraction, the Guinness Brewery will be our last stop. We tour the historical 7-floor building that is continually updated to present guests with a natural balance of industrial tradition coupled with a contemporary flare. The Storehouse also boasts unique merchandise promoting its global, world-famous brand. This evening, indulge in the culinary delights of Ireland at the pub or restaurant of your choosing as **dinner is on** your own. Overnight in Dublin. [B]

Day 10: Wednesday 10/16, DUBLIN

Dublin is home to **Trinity College** which houses the 9th-century "**Book of Kells**". We visit there, view the book, and then stop to see **St. Mary's Pro Cathedral**. The **remainder of the day is free** to explore. Those interested in souvenir shopping should check out Carroll's as the stores offer a wide selection of merchandise at quite reasonable prices. This evening, we meet in the hotel lobby for our transportation to The **Merry Ploughboy Pub for a festive farewell dinner** to the sounds of traditional Irish music. Overnight in Dublin. **[B,D]**

Day 11: Thursday, October 17, 2024, DUBLIN / USA Today we head home. Our journey offered our mind and soul a treasure trove of memories inspired by God's majestic landscape and a world we explore one pilgrimage at a time. [B]
