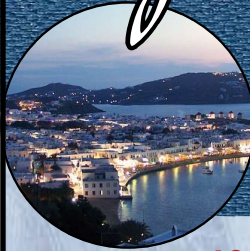

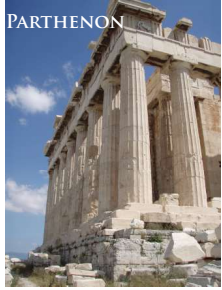

Day 1: Tuesday, September 22, 2026, USA / ATHENS
Pilgrims gather this evening at Chicago O'Hare for our overnight flight to Athens. Meals and beverages are served on board.

Day 2: Wednesday 9/23, ATHENS
[Note: What isn't completed today will be done Friday 9/25].



Upon our arrival, we enjoy a **panoramic tour**, beginning with **Hadrian's Arch and a view of the Royal Palace, the Stadium, the Temple of Zeus, and the Theatre of Dionysius**. We visit **Mars Hill, the site where St Paul expounded the subject of monotheism** before the pagan Greeks (this address is recorded in Acts 17:22-31) and the **Acropolis and museum**. The Greek word "acropolis" is used in a

broad sense to designate the fortified height of a city. Located on the Acropolis of Athens is the famous Parthenon (the main temple of Athena). *Time permitting, we walk down to explore the Ancient Agora and the ruins of the prison where Socrates was held and ultimately carried out his death sentence by drinking hemlock poison. (Please note: this pedestrian area would mean there would be a great deal of additional walking).* We will proceed to our hotel to check in for dinner and an overnight. [D]

Day 3: Thursday 9/24, ATHENS / CORINTH / ATHENS
Today we travel from Athens to the **Peloponnesian Peninsula**. The Peninsula is connected to the main body of Greece by the **Isthmus of Corinth**. We cross the Isthmus to the town of the same name, where Paul lived and worked for two years after leaving Athens. The account of the foundation of the Christian Church here by Paul, the Apostle and Patron Saint of Corinth, can be read in Acts 22. We view the **excavations, the Bema Seat, and the museum**. We **return to Athens for a night tour** of the city before continuing to a typical Greek Taverna for dinner. Overnight in Athens. [B,D]

Day 4: Friday 9/25, ATHENS
Today is a **free day** to explore on your own. **Suggestions include:** ① Spend more time at the sites we already visited; ② Visit the Panathenaic Stadium, the site of the first modern Olympics; ③ Spend some time shopping in the Plaka area; ④ Watch the sunset from the Athens Riviera or find a place to enjoy dinner and drinks; ⑤ Hike up Mount Lycabettus for a beautiful panoramic view of the city.

This evening, enjoy dinner with friends or a private sampling at the restaurant of your choice as **dinner is on your own**. [B]

Day 5: Saturday 9/26, ATHENS / PIRAEUS PORT / SAIL
Today we board our ship at the Piraeus pier, check into our balcony rooms, and settle in for a seven-day cruise of some of the islands in the Aegean sea. Dinner and overnight on board the ship. [B,D]

Day 6: Sunday 9/27, KUSADASI TURKEY (EPHESUS) / SAIL
This morning we arrive in Kusadasi, Turkey (ancient Ephesus).

EXCURSION KUS-01 (included): House of Virgin Mary & Ancient Ephesus-We visit the house where it is believed that Mary dwelled while living in Ephesus.

We visit the "site of the fourth of our Seven Wonders." Ephesus, once an Ancient Greek city, is now in Turkey. The Temple of Artemis, one of the Seven Wonders, was completed around 550BC with "more than 100 marble pillars each standing 56 feet tall. Today, a "single solitary pillar remains standing on the site. As with so many places in the Eastern Mediterranean, Ephesus changed hands many times over the centuries. But it remains one of the largest Roman archaeological sites in the region. You will be in awe of this incredible historic complex and the ruins you explore still give some idea of the original splendor of Ephesus. Among the sights to be admired still are the iconic and instantly recognizable Library of Celsus, the Gate of Augustus, Magnesias Gate, the Agora, Odeon, the Houses of the Patricians, the Great Theatre, Hadrian's Temple and the House of the Virgin Mary. One legend suggests Mary may have spent her last years here following Jesus' instruction to St John the Evangelist to look after his mother. Many consider it to have been her final home and it has become a place of pilgrimage. In 1957 the Vatican formalized this recognition." Apostle Paul lived, preached and wrote extensively here including his Letter to the Corinthians. Ephesus is one of the largest, most fascinating and most inspiring open-air archaeological museums in the world. We have time for shopping at the end of our tour."

Then, we board the ship to **sail to Rhodes**. Dinner and overnight on board the ship. [B,D]

Day 7: Monday 9/28, RHODES GREECE / SAIL
Docked in Rhodes, we **spend today exploring** the famed city.

EXCURSION RHO-01 (included): Acropolis of Lindos and the Citadel of the Knights

"We travel first to Lindos, about 55km from Rhodes Town and high above the village sits the impressive Acropolis of Lindos with the Doric Temple of Athena, built in 300 BC. Captains' mansions constructed between the 16th and 18th centuries are dotted here and there and in the heart of Lindos is the Church of the Virgin Mary with lovely frescoes from the 15th Century. Back in Rhodes is where we are really immersed in the history of the island in the Knights' Quarter. We stroll through Gate d'Amboise to walk along the Street of the Knights and see where they lived, separated according to Order, their crests still visible today. We will also see (outside) the imposing Palace of the Grand Master of the Knights of Rhodes, a medieval castle also known as the Castello. It's one of the few examples of Gothic architecture in Greece. The Byzantine citadel was built in the 7th Century, the palace itself in the fourteenth. Where the palace sits today could well have been the spot where the Colossus once stood, according to recent studies. Either way, this tour takes us into the heart of the fascinating history of Rhodes."

We set **sail to Crete**. Dinner and overnight on board the ship. [B,D]

Day 8: Tuesday 9/29, CRETE GREECE / SAIL
This morning, we disembark for a **day excursion to Agios Nikolaos** on the island of Crete.

EXCURSION AGH-02 (included): A delectable day in Crete

"From Agios Nikolaos we drive to Elounda, a quiet resort on the Bay of Elounda which uniquely complements the area's rocky geography and turquoise waters. Elounda is famed throughout the Aegean for its gorgeous green hills, its sugar-sand beaches and its pristine, inviting sea. We leave Elounda for Kritsa. Enjoy an incredible view of the Bay of Elounda and spectacular Mirabello Bay, then wander the narrow streets of the village. After Kritsa we continue to a local olive farm where the owners have designed all of its 2,000 square meters to embrace Cretan life. Olive oil, wine and raki, the traditional drink of Crete, are produced here using traditional methods from the early 20th century. On arrival you will be welcomed with a glass of raki and a snack of traditional Cretan meze while you enjoy a performance of Cretan music and folk dances. We return to picturesque Agios Nikolaos, the St. Tropez of Crete and home to many charming cafes and restaurants. The city's most famous landmark is a small lake in the centre of the city, at the foot of a cliff - the lake, known as "Voulismeni," is where the goddess, Athena, used to bathe. Also noteworthy here, in the capital of Eastern Crete, are the Archeological Museum and the cathedral, just southwest of the lake on Platia Venizelou."

We return to the ship and set **sail to Santorini**. Dinner and overnight on board. [B,D]

Day 9: Wednesday 9/30, SANTORINI GREECE / SAIL
Santorini is our island stop today. Whether it's your first or tenth time visiting, this island is gorgeous! The landscapes and whitewashed houses are stunning.

EXCURSION SAN-01 (included): Oia Village on the Caldera rim

"She is regularly described as one of the most beautiful places on the planet. There are plenty of magic moments on our excursion. One of the greatest spectacles is Oia village perched on the rim of the Caldera, the remains of a volcanic eruption. Santorini is a ring of rock around the sea. Think of it as the rim of an old volcano. First, we head to Megalochori, one of the most authentic and unspoiled villages on the island, retaining its distinctive architecture, character and charm. On our journey we will have had the lace-like caldera to our west, the little islands of Thirasia, Palea and Nea Kameni and an incredible, unsurpassable panoramic view. There is plenty of time in Oia to explore, stroll the marble-paved alleys, visit the adorable shops and capture the moments on camera. Admire the traditional buildings carved into the rocks and the unusual captain's manors, the settlement of Ammoudi at the foot of the caldera."

We return to the ship and **sail to Mykonos**. Dinner and overnight on board. [B,D]

Day 10: Thursday 10/1, MYKONOS GREECE / SAIL
Docked for the day in Mykonos, you have the day to explore independently, getting on and off the ship as often as you like. The island is renowned for its sandy beaches and historic landmarks.

Enjoy the day your way. Suggestions include: ❶ Visit the Church of Paraportiani; ❷ Tour the Kato Milli windmills (five traditional, no longer operational, white windmills crowned with wood and straw) which were built in the 16th century to mill flour; ❸ Visit the Monastery of Paleokastro and historic castle overlooking Chora; ❹ If you are looking for a charming and lively place to settle for a bit...head to Mykonos' Little Venice; Shop for local crafts and gifts; ❺ Check out some of the churches: Agios Charalambos, Agios Nikolakis (St. Nicholas), Agia Eleni Church, Metropolitan Church, etc.; ❻ At the pier there are opportunities to purchase the excursion(s) of your choice.

The ship provides meals on board. Or, you can choose to dine at your own expense at the restaurants on the island. Then, we sail overnight **to Milos**. **[B,L,D on the ship]**

Day 11: Friday 10/2, MILOS GREECE / SAIL
 Crystal blue waters coupled with the volcanic rock formations make **Milos** an incredible island stop.

EXCURSION MIL-02R (included): Step Back in Time - (Religious/Christian Catacombs)

"The island of Milos is one of the most beautiful places on earth. A short drive from the harbour takes us to Sarakiniko, an inlet of pure white stone sculpted by volcanic eruptions. This startlingly beautiful, otherworldly spot is one of the island's many geological wonders and perhaps one of the most photographed places in the Cyclades. You'll feel as if you've landed on the moon. We then travel along the coast to the cobblestone streets and alleys of Plaka, a classic Cycladic village. Plaka is known for its local pastry shops. Our next stop is the Dorian walls and column fragments. We will visit the site where the Venus de Milo (now residing in the Louvre in Paris), was discovered in 1820, then on to the marble amphitheatre, which is cut into the rocky slope of the hill near the ancient agora. Fully restored in 2015, it still includes seven intact rows of seats and offers a lovely view of the bay. Nearby is the village of Trypiti (Christian catacombs and the ruins of ancient Melos). We must walk down 87 steps to reach the catacombs, then back up upon our return."

We return to the ship and **sail back to Athens**. Dinner and overnight on board. **[B,D]**

Day 12: Saturday 10/3, PIRAEUS PORT / ATHENS / USA

After disembarkation, we head to the **airport**. We return home thankful to God for enabling us to see and experience the world one pilgrimage at a time. **[B]**

TERMS AND CONDITIONS / TOUR CONTRACT

TOUR PRICE: Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 11/28/2025 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 36 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge.

ACCOMMODATIONS: In First class hotels (except XB or XC on Cruise) or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$1999 per person and based on availability. Requests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supplement will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

MEALS: Ten full hot breakfasts, seven lunches (on cruise portion), and nine dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included. Airport fees, departure taxes, and fuel surcharges are estimated on the original invoice and adjusted at the time of ticketing.

SIGHTSEEING: By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to availability.

NOT INCLUDED: ①: Airport fees, departure taxes and fuel surcharges (est- \$599); ②: Land service tips to guides, drivers and meal servers (est.- \$151); ③: Port charges, cruise taxes and tips (est.- \$399); and ④: optional travel protection.

A travel protection flyer will be provided with more information. Also not included: airline baggage fees, luggage handlers, passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned and items of a personal nature.

NOTE: Due to limited storage space on motor coaches, Pentecost Tours entitles each passenger to one checked bag and one carry-on bag that meets airline "size/weight" allowances. Baggage fees, overweight baggage charges, and fees for additional bags fall under the responsibility of the passenger. Be aware, while you may agree to pay fees for additional luggage, there may not be room on the motor coach.

ASSISTANCE: Pilgrims who require personal assistance must be accompanied by a paying passenger who will provide that assistance.

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION: A deposit of \$700 per person is required to secure reservations, which sum will be applied to the price of the tour, with the balance to be

paid in full no later than 5/13/2026. Payment of remaining balance received after 5/13/2026 will incur a \$200 penalty and/or a delay in your final travel documents. Reservations made within 132 days of departure may be subject to a late charge.

► **[PENALTY PHASE ONE]** In the event of cancellation, refund will be made up to 4/30/2026 with a \$200 administrative fee plus any airline cancellation penalties.

► **[PENALTY PHASE TWO]** From 4/30/2026 to 5/13/2026 the cancellation penalty is \$700 plus any airline cancellation penalties.

► **[PENALTY PHASE THREE]** If cancellation is received from 5/13/2026 to 7/9/26 the refund will be subject to a minimum 75% cancellation fee plus any airline cancellation penalties, or an amount equal to expenses to the tour operator, whichever is greater.

► **[NO REFUND PHASE]** No refund for cancellations within 75 days of departure.

Credit card processing fees are non-refundable and always the responsibility of the passenger. Cancellation must be in writing and the effective date will be the date that Pentecost Tours, Inc. receives it. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 145 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. If the entire tour is cancelled by Pentecost Tours, Inc., you are entitled to a full refund.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round trip Chicago/Athens and Athens/Chicago on economy class jet via American or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare, subject to participation of ten persons on entire flight itinerary. If air/tour cancellation is effected by passenger after 5/13/2026, or after air tickets are written, whichever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice.

NOTE: Any change request/alterations to the group flight itinerary, requests for airline deviations and/or added domestic flights, automatically advances into the next penalty level or the current level, whichever is greater. Once the change request/alteration is made, those arrangements are final and can NOT be changed back to the group arrangement.

AIR SEATS: Pentecost Tours works with the Airlines' group departments to secure a block of ECONOMY seats. The airlines don't allow us to be involved in seat assignments. Seat assignments are handled at check-in by the airline and each passenger.

- If you want specific seating on the flight, you can purchase the Land Only package on any PTI pilgrimage. It is the responsibility of Land Only passengers to purchase your own flights/seat(s) and connect with the group.
- BUSINESS CLASS SEATS are the only exception as PTI may be able to help you acquire them but the typical

airline cost of for a Business Class seat is an additional \$4,000-\$8,000 per seat. Written requests must be submitted at least 90-days in advance. Once the airline accepts your request, payment is due immediately and the ticket is non-refundable.

TRAVEL PROTECTION: Travel Protection is NOT included in the tour price. We suggest that all participants purchase a plan to help protect you and your trip investment. Plans can provide benefits such as Trip Cancellation, Trip Interruption, Emergency Medical and Emergency Evacuation/Repatriation, Trip Delay, Baggage Delay and more. You will be mailed a travel protection flyer along with an enrollment and waiver form. Full terms and details of a travel insurance plan, including limitations and exclusions can be found in the travel insurance plan policy or description for coverage. Please note that Medicare does not provide coverage outside of the United States. Check with your own insurance provider to determine whether or not you are covered outside of the U.S.

RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY: Land arrangements including surface transportation: Pentecost Tours, Inc., and the participating Tour Operators operate the land tours offered under this program only as agents of the railroads, car rental contractors, steamship lines, hotels, bus operators, sight-seeing contractors and others that provide the actual land arrangements and are not liable for any act, omission, delay, injury, loss, damage or nonperformance occurring in connection with these land arrangements. American and other IATA carriers, steamship lines and other transportation companies whose services are featured in these tours are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time passengers are not on board their conveyance. The passage contract in use by these companies when issued shall constitute the sole contract between the companies and the purchaser of these tours and/or passage.

TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS: In response to world health initiatives, many countries and airlines have travel requirements that can include, but are not limited to: masks, testing, vaccines, specific documentations, etc. These requirements are the responsibility of each passenger. Passengers must have a valid, working email.

MISCELLANEOUS FEES: All changes must be in writing and may incur a per-person charge for each revision. Deposits received within 132 days of departure may incur a late registration fee.

LAND ARRANGEMENTS: The tour operator reserves the right to change the itinerary because of emergencies or extenuating circumstances beyond our control.

ERRORS: The Pentecost Tours staff does its best to provide you with accurate billing, brochures, etc. However, in the event of computer error, verbal or written human errors, we reserve the right to invoice, re-invoice, or forward corrected materials.
