### TERMS AND CONDITIONS / TOUR CONTRACT

**TOUR PRICE:** Based on tariffs and currency exchange rates in effect on 12/8/2025 and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour. The tour price is based on a minimum of 36 passengers. Should there be fewer, there could be a surcharge.

**ACCOMMODATIONS:** In first class hotels or better, based on double or triple occupancy with private facilities. Single-room supplement is \$129 per night and based on availability. Requests for a roommate are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis and are not guaranteed. The single-room supplement will be assessed if a roommate is not available when the group is finalized.

**MEALS:** Nine full hot breakfasts and eight dinners throughout the basic tour (continental breakfasts in hotels only where full breakfasts are not available). Extra charge for beverage not included in the menu of the day.

**TIPS AND TAXES:** Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included. **Airport fees, departure taxes, and fuel surcharges are estimated on the original invoice and adjusted at the time of ticketing.**

**SIGHTSEEING:** By modern motorcoach, including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary. Masses at churches indicated are subject to availability.

**NOT INCLUDED:** ①: Airport fees, departure taxes and fuel surcharges (est. - \$649); ②: tips to guides, drivers and meal servers (est. - \$17 per day); and ③: optional travel protection. A travel protection flyer will be provided with more information. Also not included: airline baggage fees, luggage handlers, passport and visa fees, laundry, wines, liquors, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned and items of a personal nature. **NOTE:** Due to limited storage space on motor coaches, Pentecost Tours entitles each passenger to one checked bag and one carry-on bag that meets airline "size/weight" allowances. **Baggage fees, overweight baggage charges, and fees for additional bags fall under the responsibility of the passenger. Be aware, while you may agree to pay fees for additional luggage, there may not be room on the motor coach.**

**ASSISTANCE:** Pilgrims who require personal assistance must be accompanied by a paying passenger who will provide that assistance.

**DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION:** A deposit of \$500 per person is required to secure reservations, which sum will be applied to the price of the tour, with the **balance to be paid in full no later than 6/28/2026.** Payment of remaining balance received after 6/28/2026 will incur a \$50 penalty and/or a delay in your final travel documents. Reservations made within 92 days of departure may be subject to a late charge.

▶ **[PENALTY PHASE ONE]** In the event of cancellation, refund will be made up to 5/31/2026 with a \$100 administrative fee plus any airline cancellation penalties.

▶ **[PENALTY PHASE TWO]** From 5/31/2026 to 6/28/2026 the cancellation penalty is \$500 plus any airline cancellation penalties.

▶ **[PENALTY PHASE THREE]** If cancellation is received after 6/28/2026 refund will be subject to a minimum 40% cancellation fee plus any airline cancellation penalties, or an amount equal to expenses to the tour operator, whichever is greater.

▶ No refund for cancellations within 65 days of departure.

**Credit card processing fees are non-refundable and always the responsibility of the passenger.** Cancellation must be in writing and the effective date will be the date that Pentecost Tours, Inc. receives it. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 120 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. If the entire tour is cancelled by Pentecost Tours, Inc., you are entitled to a full refund.

**AIR TRANSPORTATION:** Round trip Chicago/Paris and Paris/Chicago on economy class jet via American or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare, subject to participation of ten persons on entire flight itinerary. If air/tour cancellation is effected by passenger after 6/28/2026, or after air tickets are written, whichever comes first, 100% of airfare will be forfeited by passenger in addition to the penalties mentioned above. All airfares are subject to government approval and change without notice. **NOTE:** Any change request/alterations to the group flight itinerary, requests for airline devia-

tions and/or added domestic flights, automatically advances into the next penalty level or the current level, whichever is greater. Once the change request/alteration is made, those arrangements are final and can NOT be changed back to the group arrangement.

**AIR SEATS:** Pentecost Tours works with the Airlines' group departments to secure a block of ECONOMY seats. The airlines do not allow us to be involved in seat assignments. Seat assignments are handled at check-in by the airline and each passenger.

- If you want specific seating on the flight, you can purchase the Land Only package on any PTI pilgrimage. It is the responsibility of Land Only passengers to purchase your own flights/seat(s) and connect with the group.
- BUSINESS CLASS SEATS are the only exception as PTI may be able to help you acquire them but the typical airline cost of for a Business Class seat is an additional \$4,000-\$8,000 per seat. Written requests must be submitted at least 90-days in advance. Once the airline accepts your request, payment is due immediately and the ticket is non-refundable.

**TRAVEL PROTECTION:** Travel Protection is NOT included in the tour price. We suggest that all participants purchase a plan to help protect you and your trip investment. Plans can provide benefits such as Trip Cancellation, Trip Interruption, Emergency Medical and Emergency Evacuation/Repatriation, Trip Delay, Baggage Delay and more. You will be mailed a travel protection flyer along with an enrollment and waiver form. Full terms and details of a travel insurance plan, including limitations and exclusions can be found in the travel insurance plan policy or description for coverage. Please note that Medicare does not provide coverage outside of the United States. Check with your own insurance provider to determine whether or not you are covered outside of the U.S.

**RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY:** Land arrangements including surface transportation: Pentecost Tours, Inc. and the participating Tour Operators operate the land tours offered under this program only as agents of the railroads, car rental contractors, steamship lines, hotels, bus operators, sightseeing contractors and others that provide the actual land arrangements and are not liable for any act, omission, delay, injury, loss, damage or nonperformance occurring in connection with these land arrangements. American and other IATA carriers, steamship lines and other transportation companies whose services are featured in these tours are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time passengers are not on board their conveyance. The passage contract in use by these companies when issued shall constitute the sole contract between the companies and the purchaser of these tours and/or passage.

**TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS:** In response to world health initiatives, many countries and airlines are implementing travel requirements that can include, but are not limited to: masks, testing, vaccines, specific documentations, etc. These requirements are the responsibility of each passenger. Passengers must have a valid, working email.

**MISCELLANEOUS FEES:** All changes must be in writing and may incur a per-person charge for each revision. Deposits received within 92 days of departure may incur a late registration fee.

**LAND ARRANGEMENTS:** The tour operator reserves the right to change the itinerary because of emergencies or extenuating circumstances beyond our control.

**ERRORS:** The Pentecost Tours staff does its best to provide you with accurate billing, brochures, etc. However, in the event of computer error, verbal or written human errors, we reserve the right to invoice, re-invoice, or forward corrected materials.

**Day 1: Monday, September 28, 2026, USA / PARIS**

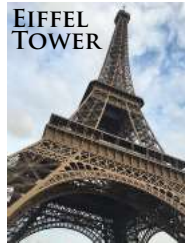
We meet this evening at an international **airport** for our overnight flight to Paris via a jumbo jet arriving the next day. Meals are served on board.

**NOTRE DAME**



**Day 2: Tuesday 9/29, PARIS / LISIEUX**

Upon our arrival in Paris, we visit the **Cathedral of Notre Dame**, the most famous Gothic Cathedral in the world devoted to the Blessed Mother. The cathedral is more than 700 years old and took 87 years to complete from the laying of the cornerstone in 1163 to the completion of the Western façade and northern rose window in 1250. It is best characterized by ogee archways, ribbed vaults, flying buttresses, rose stained glass windows, ornately crafted spires, and gargoyles, which were the guardians of grand cathedrals. From there, we stop at the **Eiffel Tower**, so you have time to absorb its massive presence and take photos. The iron giant soars 1,063 feet into the air (equivalent to an 81-story building). La Tour Eiffel, as it's known locally, was designed and erected in 1889 to serve as the entrance arch for the World's Fair that was being hosted in Paris that year. At first, the structure's aesthetic appeal was heavily criticized by influential French artists and intellectuals. However, over time the tower became a global icon making France the residence of one of the most recognized and visited structures in the world. Then, we travel to **Lisieux**, home of St Therese of the Child Jesus. She is the one whom Pope Pius X called "the greatest saint of modern times". We check-in at our hotel for a **welcome dinner** and overnight. [D]



**Day 3: Wednesday 9/30, LISIEUX / MONT SAINT MICHEL / NORMANDY / LISIEUX**

We take a daytrip today to two places, both challenging and incredible in their own way. First, we stop at **Mont Saint-Michel**, a marvel of French architecture that took nearly 500 years to build. This mass of granite, rising 400 feet from the sea, is crowned by a monastery built in the 13th century with fortifications to withstand attacks by the English. **NOTE: Uneven pavement, steps, and walking may make this visit a challenge for some.** From there, we travel to **Normandy** where we learn more about the events of World War II's D-day. We see and learn more about the Battle of Normandy invasion

(1944), which was the kick-start of the largest amphibious campaign in warfare history. By air, land, and sea, troops from Canada, the United States, and the United Kingdom joined other allied forces to liberate northwestern Europe from Nazi occupation. We absorb the history, the magnitude of the operation, and give solemn thanks to all who sacrificed their lives for the mission. We spend time at the **American Military Cemetery and the Museum of the D'Day Invasion**. Our day concludes as we **return to Lisieux** for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

**MONT SAINT MICHEL**



**Day 4: Thursday 10/1, LISIEUX**

After breakfast we visit **Les Buissonnets**, the family home where Therese spent the early years of her life. Next, we visit the **Carmelite Convent** that Therese entered at the age of fifteen. The convent houses the sacred relic of her body. From there, we visit the beautiful **Basilica of St Therese**, built and dedicated to beloved saint. The **remainder of the day is free** for personal sightseeing, shopping, prayer and reflection. We return to the hotel for dinner and an overnight. [B,D]

**Day 5: Friday 10/2, LISIEUX / CHARTRES / NEVERS**

We bid farewell to Lisieux this morning and make our way southwest of Paris to **Chartres**. The Cathedral of Chartres is one of the greatest architectural treasures ever built and today boasts nearly perfect preservation of its original details and design from 1260. According to tradition, the Cathedral houses the Blessed Virgin Mary's tunic (Sancta Camisia), said to have been offered to the cathedral by Charlemagne who had accepted the gift during a trip he made to the holy city of Jerusalem. Drawing visitors from all over the world, the **Chartres Cathedral** has been and continues to be a popular and important Marian pilgrimage site. The stained-glass windows dating from the 12th and 13th centuries are renowned for the depth and intensity of their blue tones, known as Chartres blue. From there, we proceed south-east to **Nevers** to check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

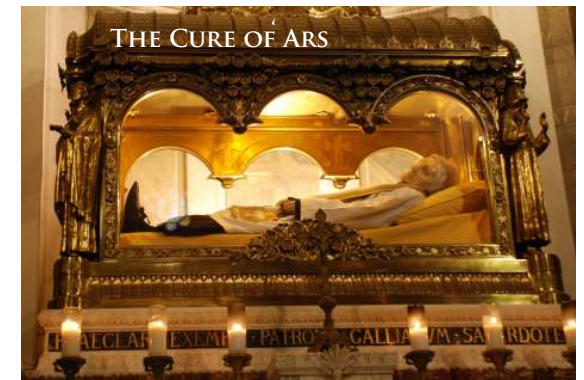
**Day 6: Saturday 10/3, NEVERS / PARAY-LE-MONIAL / LYON**

St Bernadette spent the last 13 years of her life at the **Convent of St Gildard** in Nevers. That will be our first stop today. We view St Bernadette's incorrupt body and see the same fingers that dug in the earth at Massabielle in Lourdes and the same eyes that saw the Blessed Virgin Mary. From there we travel to **Paray-le-Monial**. This is

the site of the apparitions of our Lord to St Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1673. It is here that she received the inspiration to increase devotion of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We visit the **Chapel of the Apparitions**. Then, we stop at the **church of St Claude la Colombiere**, the spiritual director of St Margaret Mary. Our day concludes as we arrive in **Lyon** and check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,D]

**Day 7: Sunday 10/4, LYON / ARS / LYON**

We spend today in Ars learning about St John Vianney, patron of parish priests. We **visit the former home of the Curé**, the **Basilica of Ars** and the **underground church**. We also have the opportunity to receive the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** in the confessional where he spent 17 hours a day for over 30 years. We **see his incorrupt body** and have **free time to explore** on our own. We return to the hotel in Lyon for dinner and overnight. [B,D]



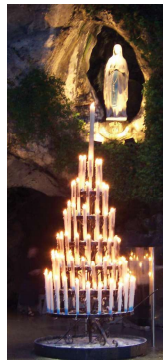
**Day 8: Monday 10/5, LYON / train / TOULOUSE / LOURDES**

It's a travel morning as we head to the **Lyon rail station for our 1st class train to Toulouse**. Upon arrival, we connect with our **motor coach** and travel to **Lourdes**. Between February 11, 1858 and July 16, 1858, Our Lady appeared 18 times to the 14-year-old girl named Bernadette Soubirous. The young saint describes Our Lady as a "girl in white, the same height as myself, who greeted me with a nod of her head. This girl was beautiful beyond description. She had a blue sash around her white dress and yellow roses on her shoes. A long rosary hung from her arm, and she seemed to invite me to pray with her." Our Lady gave Bernadette secret messages for herself and other messages for the world to hear. She described herself as the "Immaculate Conception", she revealed a miraculous spring and she asked

that a chapel be built for pilgrimage. We visit the **Basilica of the Immaculate Conception and the Grotto of Massabielle**. We check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. **[B,D]**



**Day 9: Tuesday 10/6, LOURDES**

Today will be spent in Lourdes. We celebrate **Mass at the Grotto of Massabielle (subject to confirmation)**, visit the **Boly Mill** where St Bernadette was born and the **“Cachot,”** an abandoned prison where Bernadette’s family lived in poverty. The **remainder of the day is free** to enjoy as you choose. Suggestions include:

- 1 Pray the Stations of the Cross on the hillside by the Basilica.
- 2 Re-visit the Grotto
- 3 Find the perfect place to observe the culture and French people.
- 4 Take the lift (elevator) on the other side of the River Gave and visit the cemetery where the Soubirous family is buried.
- 5 Visit the Chateau “Fort” for a spectacular view of the city and self-guided tour inside the fort walls.
- 6 Spend some time shopping at some of the many shops in the area.

Then, we participate in the **Candlelight Procession** with pilgrims from around the world. **Dinner is on your own.** **[B]**

**Day 10: Wednesday 10/7, LOURDES / train / PARIS**



Early this morning, we proceed to the **train depot** for our **high-speed 1st class train to Paris**. Our first stop will be at the **Shrine of the Miraculous Medal on Rue de Bac**, where Our Lady appeared to St. Catherine Laboure

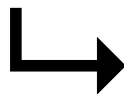
in 1830. There we see the incorrupt body of St. Catherine and the waxed body of St. Louise de Marillac who, with the help of St. Vincent de Paul, established the Daughters of Charity. From there we proceed to **Montmartre hill** where we ascend by funicular to the world-famous **Basilica of Sacre-Coeur**. In the Basilica, above the high altar, there is a monstrance containing the Consecrated Host. The practice of perpetual adoration has been uninterrupted in Sacre Coeur since 1885. This evening, we enjoy a **farewell dinner with wine and panoramic views at a restaurant in the Eiffel Tower**. **[B,D]**

**Day 11: Thursday, October 8, 2026, PARIS / USA**

We head to the airport for the journey home. Our adventure offers a treasure trove of new memories inspired by God’s majestic landscape and a world we explore one pilgrimage at a time. **[B]**
